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## Notice of Public Hearing Regarding Proposed Rates and Fees

Notice Date: March 18, 2025, Hearing Dates: May 13 and May 20, 2025

You are receiving this notice because our records indicate that you are a Laguna County Sanitation District customer.

If you are not a district customer, please disregard this notice.

This notice describes proposed sewer rate increases and how you can participate in the process. The district's sewer rate structure is based on a comprehensive rate study model to evaluate costs of service as required by Articles XIII C and D of the California Constitution (Proposition 218).

Why are sewer rates increasing?

- The rate increase is to keep up with inflation and is consistent with a recently prepared rate study. The proposed rate structure is inclusive of the revenue requirements associated with the plant upgrade which was recently constructed to replace antiquated facilities based on the findings of a master plan presented to the board October 11, 2011. See https:// www.countyofsb.org/1355/Laguna-Sanitation or contact the district office for more information. This rate adjustment is necessary to pay the costs to construct and operate the new facilities in addition to providing the required reserves for replacement and depreciation of existing and proposed facilities.
- An increase of 3.5 % is proposed.

How will the proposed changes impact my sewer bill?

- District sewer charges are generally billed annually on the tax roll along with your property taxes. Most customers are billed a flat rate on a per connection basis.
- For your property at APN 103-305-012, the proposed fiscal year 2025-2026 sewer service charge is \$1178.21

#### How do I protest?

To protest this action, the property owner must provide a written statement including owner or occupant name and address or assessor's parcel number, to the Clerk of the Board on the 4th floor of the County Administration Building at 105 East Anapamu Street, Santa Barbara, CA 93101 prior to the hearing date. You may also provide your written protest at the hearing.

## How and when would the increase become effective?

The rate increase would be imposed if there is less than a majority written protest of property owners. The new rate would apply to July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026.

## **INFORMATION**

#### **Lateral Maintenance**

Most sewer systems rely on gravity flow to operate. Your sewer lateral, which extends from your building to the sewer main, periodically requires maintenance to help prevent flow obstructions. The age and material of your lateral play a factor but ordinarily roots from trees and shrubs are attracted to water and if your lateral line is cracked, roots will grow towards the water source, enter the lateral line and eventually obstruct flow. Illegal disposal of substances such as cooking grease further contribute to plugging problems. Contact a licensed plumber or drain service for your maintenance needs.

### **Backwater Valve**

Backwater valves are used on lateral lines to prevent back-ups due to obstructions in the main line. The district requires backwater valves on all new and replacement laterals. Existing building laterals must have backwater valves if the drainage fixtures are lower than the next upstream manhole cover. Only backwater valves approved by the California Plumbing Code may be used. Installation of such devices may require a permit and should periodically be inspected to ensure it is in good working order.

#### **Bathroom Wipes and other Waste**

Do not dispose of trash items such as toilet wipes or scrubs, or substances such as egg shells, cooking oil, fat or grease through the sewer. It is against the County Code for *anyone* to dispose of such substances from whatever source through the sewer. Commercial operations such as restaurants are required to have grease traps or interceptors and industrial waste generators are required to install a pre-treatment facilities to remove these wastes from the sewer system.

#### **Water Softeners**

Salt load water softeners pollute and are prohibited in homes after January 1, 2012. If you have one prior to that date, please consider using a canister exchange softener. Contact our office for information on a rebate program to change your salt load softener for a canister exchange softener.

### **Sewer System Management**

The Laguna County Sanitation District sewer collection system is regulated by the State Water Resources Control Board. A sewer system management plan addressing its operation can be viewed at: https://www.countyofsb.org/1355/Laguna-Sanitation

## **Water Softener Prohibition**

Please note that there is a prohibition on the use of regenerating (salt load) water softeners for new homes and commercial development after January 1, 2012 (Ordinance 4821 per Section 29-26.1 of the County Code), and any development in the Rice Ranch tracts.

## Exchange Your Water Softener and Save \$400!

If you have a regenerating water softener not otherwise prohibited, the District, along with local water service companies, have a promotional opportunity to encourage you to install a canister exchange softener\*. With removal of your regenerating water softener and proof of a canister exchange agreement, we will credit your account \$250. In addition, these local water service companies offer a new customer incentive programs which can save you an additional \$150 – for a total savings of \$400.

\*This program is limited to residential homeowners who own an operable salt load regenerating water softener and are served by the Laguna County Sanitation District. Qualifying customer must enter into a 2-year service agreement with Culligan or CalSoft. After proof of removal of existing regenerating water softener and 2-year service agreement, the District will deposit \$250 to your water softener service account with either Culligan or CalSoft. Early termination may result in penalties. For additional information regarding water softener treatment or the need to reduce salt to the sewer system, please call the District at (805) 803-8750.

Cooking oil and grease from food prep clogs sewers. Keep them out of the drain by scraping plates and cookware before washing and secure in a plastic bag along with sink strainer waste for trash disposal. Pour out all cooking oil and grease into a container and store in the freezer for disposal in the trash on your collection day or approved household hazardous waste center.

Medications may not be flushed down the toilet but can be taken for free to drop-boxes located at pharmacies and at ne Sheriff station at 812-A West Foster Road in Santa Maria. This includes prescription and over-the-counter drugs. Please keep medica containers and remove or scratch out all personal information. As a customer in your district APN 111-151-020 I am writing in protest against the proposed increase in my sewer bill. There needs to be a change on how a property is taxed for sewer usage. I called the district office for their definition of Multiple Family Residence. I was told Every parcel is billed as a single family residence. This worked and was fine when only one family lived in a SINGLE FAMILY residence. My household consists of two. My neighbor on my left has a household of 12. That residence has 10 times more the amount of sewage than me. My neighbor on my right has a household of 11. A single family dwelling used to mean one family with the same last name living in it. That is no longer the case here in Santa Maria. Many households consist of more than one family. Yet we are all being taxed the same. Their has to be a fairer way for the sewer tax to be calculated. A way to calculate the amount of sewage coming from each house or at least a way to calculate the sewage by the household number. This can be provided by the homeowner.

## Other thoughts;

Have the new housing developments in Orcutt pay more. Their sewage has to travel so much further than the sewage coming from the Tanglewood Development where I live. The sewer plant is very close. Yet we pay the same. Also, the farmers benefit by using the gray water on their fields, do they contribute to the expense of the sewer system??

I feel the proposed increase of 3.5% is much to high for existing customers. The Laguna Plant was just improved 2 or 3 years ago. If it needs to expand more to process the sewage from the new housing being constructed then those developments should be charged more.

Many home owners in Santa Maria are senior citizens or retired. The price of everything has gone up. Our utilities have all gone up. We are told by each company, oh, its just a small increase. Well all those small increases add up and when your on a fixed income its going to be Very hard to remain in your life long home.
