- A. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute a Resolution to establish a Disabled Persons parking zone on Broadway in the Old Town Orcutt area, Fourth Supervisorial District; and
- B. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute a Resolution to establish a Disabled Persons parking zone on Lillie Avenue in the Summerland area, First Supervisorial District; and
- C. Find that the proposed action is for the operation, leasing or licensing of an existing public structures, facilities, mechanical equipment or topographical feature, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that which presently exists, that the proposed action is therefore exempt from CEQA pursuant to 14 CCR 15301 and approve the filing of a Notice of Exemption on that basis.

# **Summary Text:**

The contractor and owner of a new business in the Old Town Orcutt area requested that Public Works establish a Disabled Persons parking zone at a location in the front of a new office building on Broadway within the County of Santa Barbara. Establishing Disabled Persons parking allows better access to the ADA ramp installed in the front of the office building.

A constituent in the Summerland area requested that Public Works reestablish a Disabled Persons parking zone that was in place prior to the circulation improvement project. Staff will monitor the use of Disabled

Persons parking locations along Lillie Avenue over time to determine potential future needs in the public right of way.

Based upon our investigation and addressing safety concerns, Public Works has determined that there is a need for these Disabled Persons parking zones. The attached Resolutions were prepared to establish a Disabled Persons parking zone at the following locations:

#### **ADOPT**

### **Disabled Persons parking ZONE**

- On the east side of Broadway, beginning at a point 234 feet north of the centerline of Clark Avenue, ending at a point 254 feet north of the centerline of Clark Avenue.
- On the south side of Lillie Avenue, beginning at a point 257 feet west of the centerline of Colville Street, ending at a point 285 feet west of the centerline of Colville Street

### **BACKGROUND**

Parking restrictions are either established or rescinded based upon safety, necessity, and how they relate to the use by the community as a whole. Public Works weighs all of these factors and presents any recommended changes to the Board of Supervisors for approval. These parking restrictions may include no parking, loading zones, vehicle height restricted parking, angle parking, Disabled Persons parking, or any combination of these restrictions. Disabled Persons parking zones are not required or mandated in the public right of way. When a request is made for Disable Persons parking in the public right of way, the Department reviews the request individually in the context of the location and needs of each community or area.

In Old Town Orcutt, Planning and Development allows properties to develop without providing parking outside the road right of way due to spatial constraints on lot size. As a result, most parking in Old Town Orcutt is in the road right of way. Because of this, the Department evaluates parking as new development occurs to determine if creating Disabled Persons parking nearby in the road right of way best serves the community.

The Department recommends establishing these Disabled Persons parking zones to provide safer parking locations for persons with disabilities.
