Authorize and refer a Minute Order to the Elections Division of the County Clerk-Recorder-Assessor to administer the election for the Board of Retirement.

Summary Text:

These elections are required by the County Employees Retirement Law which controls the Santa Barbara County Employees' Retirement System. The terms of three elected positions on the Board of Retirement will expire on December 31, 2014. Administering Board elections is outside the normal scope of work for retirement system staff. However, the Elections Division of the County Clerk-Recorder-Assessor has procedures and experienced staff to efficiently administer the election. Therefore, the Board of Retirement has requested to outsource the administration of the election to the Elections Division of the County Clerk-Recorder-Assessor.

The Board of Retirement is composed of nine members with two alternates (four members appointed by the Board of Supervisors, one of which may be a member of the Board of Supervisors, two elected general members, one elected safety member, one elected retired member, and the County Treasurer as an ex-officio member. There are two elected alternates; to the safety and retired members). The elections this year are for one general member position and the retired and alternate retired member. Therefore the ballots for three separate elections will have to be polled, unless there is only one qualified candidate for any of the positions, in which case that candidate is declared the winner.

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Fiscal Analysis:

The Retirement System will reimburse the County Clerk-Recorder-Assessor for its services.
