Exhibit A: Gaviota Overlook Region Map




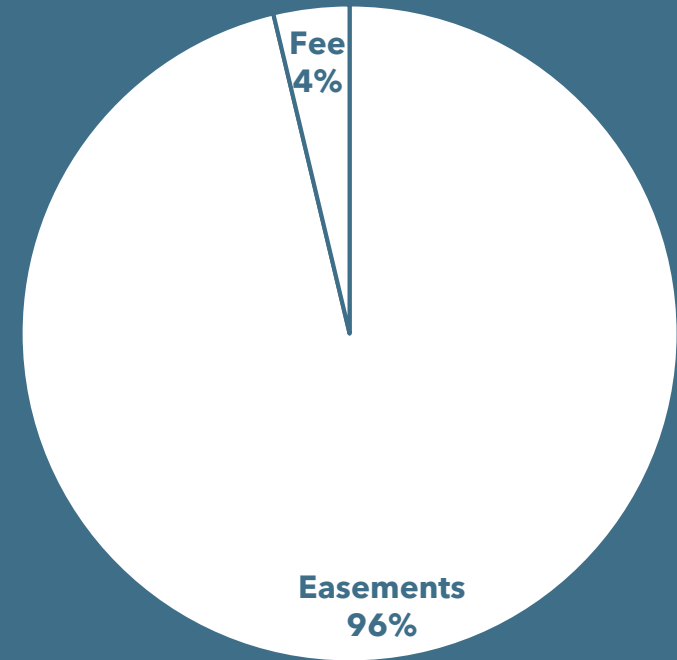


Conserved Places

Acquisition -	\$2,750,000
Diligence, staff time, campaign costs-	\$250,000
Improvements, trails, fencing, signage, picnic tables, benches -	\$100,000
Endowment contribution towards preserve management -	\$400,000
Total Costs -	\$3,500,000
