  - b) The associated provisions in 8 U.S.C. 1324a(a)(1) that, generally speaking, make it unlawful, in the United States, to hire (or recruit for employment) certain aliens.
- 3) Provide training (to the extent necessary) to those persons required by this condition to be notified of the Grant Subaward requirement for employment eligibility verification and of the associated provisions of 8 U.S.C. 1324a(a)(1).



The budget for the XC Program incorporates the equivalent of salary and benefit costs totaling \$134,990 (salary) and \$72,686 (benefits) for 1.95 FTE Victim Witness Program Advocates for the grant period. The Advocates have completed mandatory advanced advocate training, and are bilingual-bicultural. The Advocates will be responsible for all direct provision of comprehensive Victim/Witness services.

Operating costs of \$3,578 are budgeted to ensure training during the duration of the grant for the two assigned staff. The training will include trauma informed training and additional TBD training for advocates as appropriate.

An additional \$666 is budgeted to produce outreach materials, including community resource cards with helpful phone numbers and contacts to distribute to victims. The District Attorney's Office Administrative Office requires \$21,192 to offset the costs of administrative grant and fiscal reporting.

### **Project Narrative**

#### **Problem Statement**

The United States Census Bureau estimates the population of Santa Barbara County as being 446,475 (2021). Santa Barbara County's demographics are approximately 43% White, 47% Hispanic, 6% Asian-American, 2% African-American and 2% Native American. Santa Barbara County has two major population centers at opposite ends of the county: the greater Santa Barbara area (south) and the Santa Maria Valley (north), along with population centers within the central county area (Lompoc and Santa Ynez Valley). The city of Santa Maria is the largest and fastest growing incorporated city within Santa Barbara County, with 54% of the total county population. Santa Maria and Lompoc have many socio-economic factors which contribute to the highest rates of crime.

According to the 2021 census, 76% of persons living in Santa Maria identified as Hispanic or Latino up from 70% in 2010. Northern Santa Barbara County's agricultural economy and population continues to expand due to a steady increase in the production of labor-intensive crops. The growing population of non-English speaking immigrants has provided a ready pool of vulnerable victims who are fearful or distrusting of law enforcement, cannot fluently communicate, and may fear deportation by revealing their immigration status. Parts of the city

encompass large populations of migrant workers, and they are common targets for crime. Particularly in these communities, there is a high percentage of unsolved crime due to the aforementioned factors. Unless the law enforcement agency or detectives refer an individual directly to the Victim-Witness Program and the individual follows through with a phone call, a victim does not receive services to assist in the recovery in the aftermath of a crime. The initial contact with law enforcement may be the only opportunity to engage otherwise resistant victims to services. This is a serious problem in Santa Maria, and one that we have addressed with XC funding.

Additional Victim Advocate personnel affords access to critical services for victims of violent crime in the northern region of Santa Barbara County including key partnerships with indigenous grass-roots organizations who assist the Mixteco population with access to resources and translation services. Additional Advocate staff are readily available to the North County law enforcement agencies, to provide information to victims and their family members immediately following the initial report. The advocates can provide timely crisis intervention, orientation to the criminal justice process, case/investigative status, resource/referral counseling, and emergency financial and victim compensation services.

### Plan

#### Gaps and Needs

Victim/Witness services have not kept pace with the rising crime rate in North County, which has increased 42% since 2012. There has been a 69% increase in violent crime in the city of Lompoc, and a 39% in the city of Santa Maria. During the last 24 months, there has been a precipitous uptick in unsolved shootings in Lompoc and assaults, generally in the northern part of the county. Given these increases and declining law enforcement personnel resources, many victims' cases are unresolved due to lack of investigative leads and no arrest. Thus, the victim is not referred to the District Attorney's Office for Victim/Witness Assistance services.

#### How Plan addresses the Gaps and Needs

The Victim-Witness Director has worked with Santa Maria and Lompoc Police Departments to develop a referral system to cross report new cases involving violent crimes when a suspect has yet to be arrested. Specifically, the Director met with the Lompoc Police Chief to implement an electronic referral system to send victim reports to our Lompoc based Advocates to expedite services. An advocate is also co-located at the Santa Maria Police Department (SMPD) in their detective bureau. She is readily available for walk-in victims, and acts as a

resource to SMPD personnel to provide early victim intervention during the investigation. Both advocates assigned to the grant are bilingual-bicultural, and provide trauma informed crisis intervention and orientation to the criminal justice system at a critical time, which helps facilitate early Victim/Witness service provision and engagement. Grant funding has enabled more timely services to victims of crime in the North County, particularly in unsolved crimes, and crimes under investigation but not yet referred to the District Attorney's Office.

### **Measurable Objectives**

The funded advocates focus attention on victims within the city of Lompoc, with the second advocate also providing assistance for Santa Maria. With funding from the XC Program, we will continue to make every effort to contact cooperative victims of unsolved violent crimes and next of kin in North County.

### **Plan to Sustain Services**

Since 1978, the District Attorney has received partial funding through Cal OES to provide comprehensive services to crime victims in Santa Barbara County. Since that time, our Program has evolved to become a three office, Countywide program offering comprehensive mandatory and optional services to victims of crime. The Victim/Witness Assistance Program is designated by the County Board of Supervisors as the primary provider of victim services, and receives some

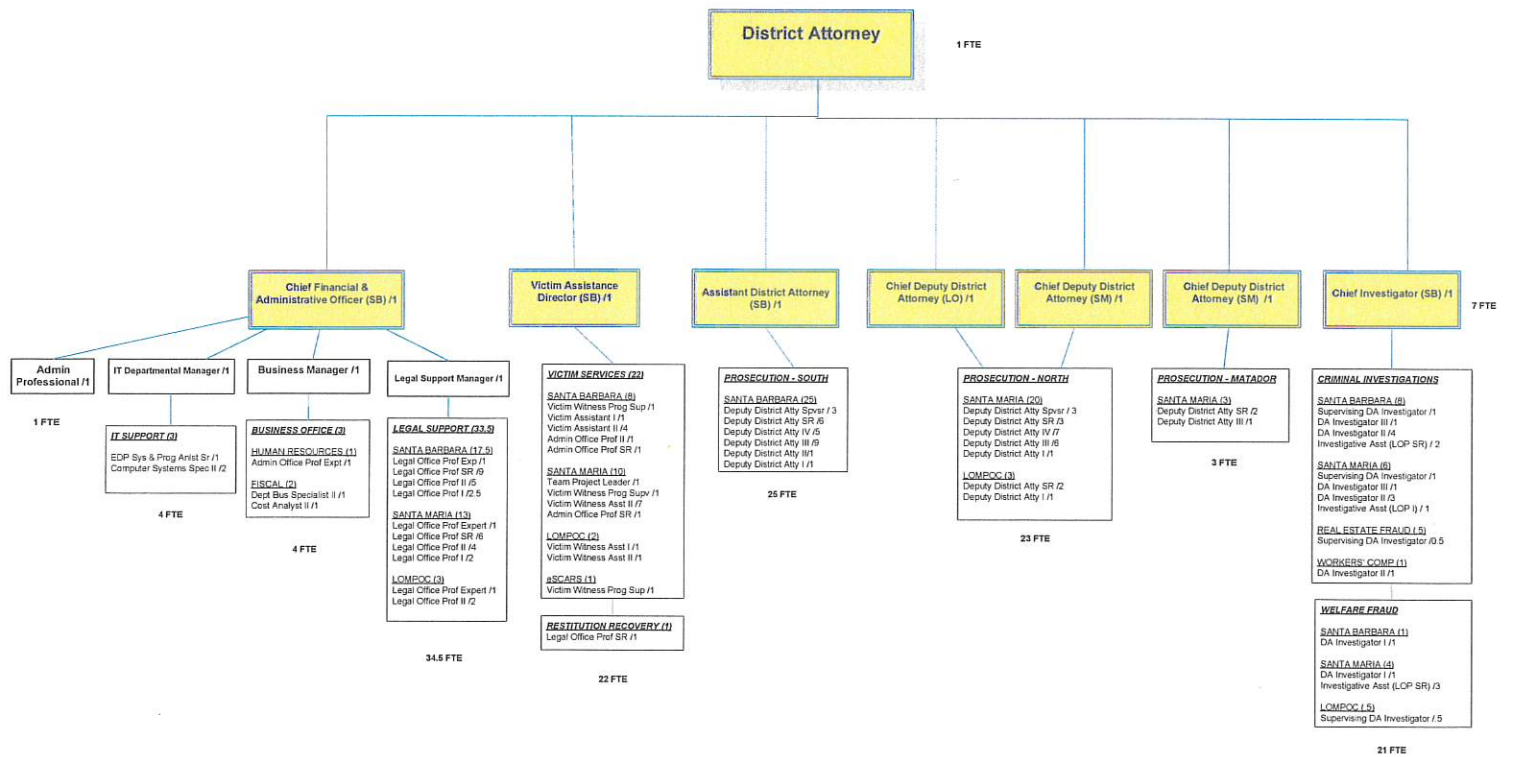

County General Fund support. Notwithstanding the support of XC grant funds, the Program continues to seek additional state and federal grant resources to enable the program to enhance services to victims of crime in the North County, including those that otherwise would be unserved because their cases are under investigation or unsolved.

### **Volunteers**

In order to effectively balance the workload, volunteers make contact with victims of crime. Volunteers contact victims of some assaults, theft, property crimes, and DUI crimes. The Advocate Volunteer assesses the crime and initiates contact. Volunteers also process criminal protective orders, ensuring that victims receive them from the courts in a timely fashion. We rely on local community colleges and word of mouth for our volunteers. The volunteers provide a range of services including case status, orientation to the criminal justice system, and restitution assistance. The volunteers record their time on volunteer time sheets, which are submitted to the Program Manager quarterly.


