Most importantly, I deeply care about the people of this county and the issues at hand.

In regards to the Mandatory Offer of Residential Lease component of the ordinance, there has to be a better way to seek solutions and achieve goals.

- The direct and indirect impacts have not been analyzed and thoroughly discussed by tenants/owners/management companies and the Board of Supervisors.
  - The unintended consequences of such measures that are rushed through the process leave tenants and owners to pick up the pieces.
- Government, property owner and tenant relations will be negatively impacted, which is counterproductive to accomplishing housing goals.
- The language as outlined within the ordinance is vague and ambiguous. Among industry professionals, there is much confusion and many questions regarding the applicability of the ordinance.
- Timely and cumbersome admin tasks and discussions are added to the rental process for both tenants and landlords alike, which create undue burdens for both parties in a process that has unforgiving timelines.
- Per my conversation with multiple property owners, these types of governmental controls will lead to the sale of their rental/income properties, therefore depleting inventory.

Landlords and Tenants are impacted when these types of ordinances are rushed through the process. There has to be a better way.

My offer stands to help, to seek solutions that are meaningful and achieve those solutions together.

I respectfully request that you hold over this item so that the community (including tenants and landlords) can understand the lasting impacts, both direct and indirect.
