SUBJECT: Acceptance of State of California, Alcohol Beverage Control Grants Funds

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Approve acceptance \$50,000.00 in resource and use allocation of Grant Assistance Program funds from the State of California, Department of Alcohol Beverage Control for specialized enforcement of alcohol laws and regulations in the Isla Vista area.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendation(s) are primarily aligned with Goal No. 2- Ensure Public Health and Safety and Provide Essential Infrastructure.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

Each year the State of California, Department of Alcohol Beverage Control awards grants of \$50,000.00 to increase enforcement of underage drinking laws and reduce alcohol consumption by underage individuals. This year the Isla Vista Foot Patrol applied for the named grant and was awarded funding. Alcohol issues have been a major concern for the Isla Vista Foot Patrol for many years and this grant award will assist in providing a greater level of enforcement of alcohol laws. The grant funds will provide overtime hours for current Isla Vista Foot Patrol personnel as well as required specialized training. There will be no addition of personnel.

Programs to achieve the desired goals will include License Education on Alcohol and Drugs (LEAD), Grant Assistance Program (GAP), Informed Merchants Preventing Alcohol-Related Crimes and Tendencies (IMPACT), and Decoy Shoulder Tap Program.

Mandates and Service Levels:

Per the grant agreement, the Governing Board overseeing the jurisdiction of the applicant must approve the awarding of the grant funding pursuant to agreement #03UCP-06. This is the first such grant awarded to the Sheriff's Department.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

The grant will provide overtime funding for existing Isla Vista Foot Patrol personnel to perform the various enforcement programs and there will be no impact on existing budgetary concerns.

There are no anticipated facility impacts in continuing this grant program.
