Recommended Actions:

Adopt the attached resolution to authorize the submittal of a regional application for the California Integrated Waste Management Board's Fourteenth Cycle Used Oil Recycling Block Grant in the estimated amount of \$52,000.

Summary Text:

The Resource Recovery and Waste Management Division proposes to submit a regional application on behalf of the County and the Cities of Buellton, Goleta, and Solvang to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for a non-competitive Used Oil Recycling Block Grant in the estimated amount of \$52,000. The Used Oil Recycling Block Grant Program provides funds to cities, counties, and other local agencies to help prevent the improper disposal of used motor oil.

If awarded, the Fourteenth Cycle Used Oil Recycling Block Grant (Fiscal Year 2008/2009) will be used to fund public education and outreach activities regarding the proper management of used motor oil and oil filters. The Santa Barbara County Public Works Department has participated in the State's grant program since 1997.

The California Integrated Waste Management Board requires the governing body of each local government participating in the program to authorize submittal of the grant application; therefore, in addition to the requested Board Resolution, the application will include authorization letters from each of the County’s regional partners (the Cities of Buellton, Goleta, and Solvang).

Background:

The California Oil Recycling Enhancement Act (Statutes of 1991, Chapter 817) authorizes the collection of four cents from oil manufacturers for every quart of lubricating oil sold, transferred, or imported into California. With the collected funds, the Act mandates the California Integrated Waste Management Board to provide used oil collection opportunities and non-competitive Used Oil Recycling Block Grants to local governments to establish used oil collection and education programs.

The Fourteenth Cycle Used Oil Recycling Block Grant will further the efforts of the County to comply with the mandates set forth in the 1989 California Integrated Waste Management Act (Public Resources Code, Title 14, Division 7). The Act requires submittal of a Household Hazardous Waste Element (HHWE) that describes the recommended programs to divert household hazardous waste, including used motor oil and filters, from landfills. Your Board adopted the HHWE on February 4, 1992.
