SUBJECT:	Set hearing for a report on Sudden Oak Death

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors set a hearing on May 10, 2005 to receive a report on Sudden Oak Death, a disease that to date has not been found in Santa Barbara County.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendation is primarily aligned with Goal No. 5.A High Quality of Life for All Residents.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

First found in Marin County in 1995, Sudden Oak death (SOD), caused by the fungus <u>Phytophthora</u> <u>ramorum</u> has now been confirmed in 14 counties in the San Francisco Bay area. At the request of Supervisor Firestone, this report will include the following topics:

- 1. The history, causal agent and impact of the disease
- 2. Surveys for the disease in Santa Barbara County
- 3. Review of quarantines and other efforts to keep SOD out of Santa Barbara County
- 4. Requirements to move plant material from Santa Barbara County to other states

Mandates and Service Levels:

Quarantine programs are mandated by California Code of Regulations, Title 3, Section 3700 and Federal Domestic Quarantine number 301.92

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

The department is reimbursed for the cost of this program through a contract with the California Department of Food and Agriculture
