DEAR SUPERVISORS

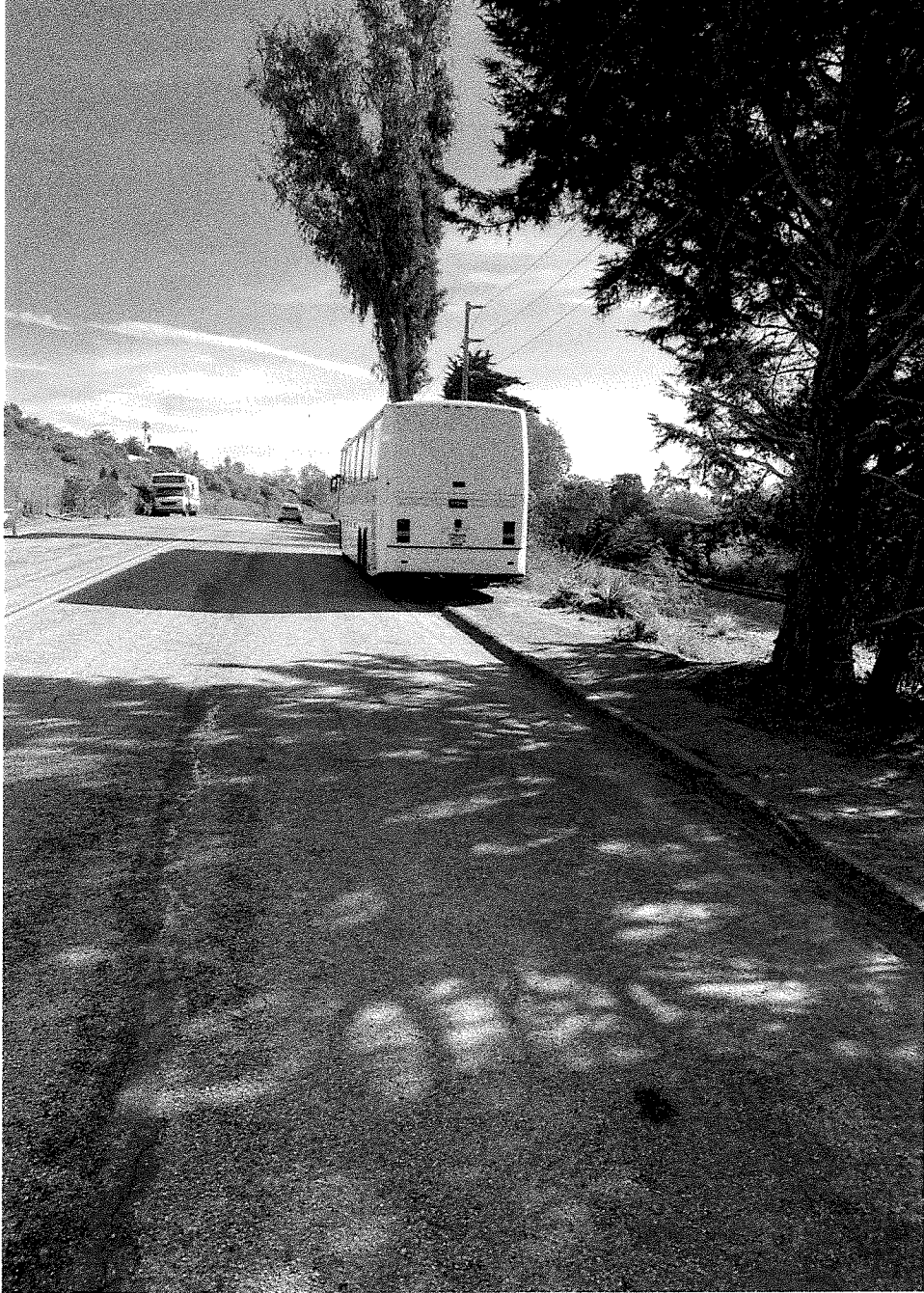

Currently there is an out of state motorhome and a camper with a fake License plate that have been parked there for days. This is serious public health and safety issue. Lookout Park closes at dusk which is the controlled safe railroad crossing to the beach. We strongly support daytime parking for individuals and families using the beach.

We also think it's important that the the " no overnight parking restriction" also apply to the North side of Wallace ,otherwise these vehicles will simply park or abandon on that side . I am including two current picture(taken today) but these incidents happen regularly . The picture of the out of state motorhome is on the South side and the camper with the forged plates is on the North Side. These restrictions will facilitate law enforcement having a clear reason to control these parked or abandoned vehicles.
