That the Board of Supervisors execute an agreement with the City of Santa Barbara for the period of July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010, for implementation of the Community Arts grant program, Community Events and Festival funding, Organizational Development grants, and staffing costs in the amount of \$485,523.00.

Summary Text:

The County of Santa Barbara is required to enter into an agreement each year with the City of Santa Barbara for the provision of various arts programs, which are administered by the County Arts Commission. This successful partnership, which has existed for the past 25 years, enables the city and the County to work together to deliver high quality art and cultural services to the community.

The attached agreement, upon execution by the Board, will implement the Community Arts grants program, Community Events & Festivals grant funding, Organizational Development Grants, and Arts Commission staffing costs for FY 2009-10, in the total amount of \$485,523.



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Background:

This is the 25th consecutive year of the County's contractual arrangement with the City of Santa Barbara to provide funding for cooperative programs administered by the County Arts Commission. This annual agreement enables the City and the County, working together as partners, to deliver high quality art and cultural services to the community.

The City's contribution continues to leverage State and private funding that provides additional services to residents and visitors. Funding is provided for areas of service and programs outlined in the contract.

Service elements include providing administrative resources and staff support for City Arts committees, and the provision of technical assistance and training to artists, cultural organizations, and City agencies. Program elements include regranting of funds through the Community Art Program, the Events and Festivals Community Promotion Program, the Organizational Development Program, and the Cultural District Program.

The total amount of the grant agreement is 485,523 and covers the period of July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

The revenue and expenditures associated with this grant have been included in the Arts Commission's adopted FY 2009-10 budget.
