# Novavax - New Vaccine Available

- Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine available under EUA for individuals 12 years of age and older
- Authorized as a 2-dose primary series given 3 to 8 weeks apart.
- FDA-approved protein-based vaccines used widely for decades and include vaccines to prevent hepatitis B and shingles.
- Not approved as a Booster



# Booster-bivalent Vaccine Availability

- Pfizer and Moderna bivalent Covid-19 vaccines include mRNA from prevalent BA.4/BA.5 strains of SARS-CoV-2
- Monovalent mRNA vaccines are no longer authorized for booster doses for people ages 12 years and older.
- However, children ages 5-11 years are recommended to receive the Pfizer monovalent booster.



# Booster-bivalent Vaccine Availability

- Moderna bivalent approved by the FDA on August 31, 2022 for those 18 years and older
- Pfizer bivalent approved by the FDA on August 31, 2022 for those 12 years and older.
- Western States Scientific Safety Review Workgroup issued recommendations September 3, 2022. Local shipments began September 5, 2022.
- Available at: Pharmacies, FQHC, Community Health Centers, Private Providers, Cottage and Lompoc Hospital.



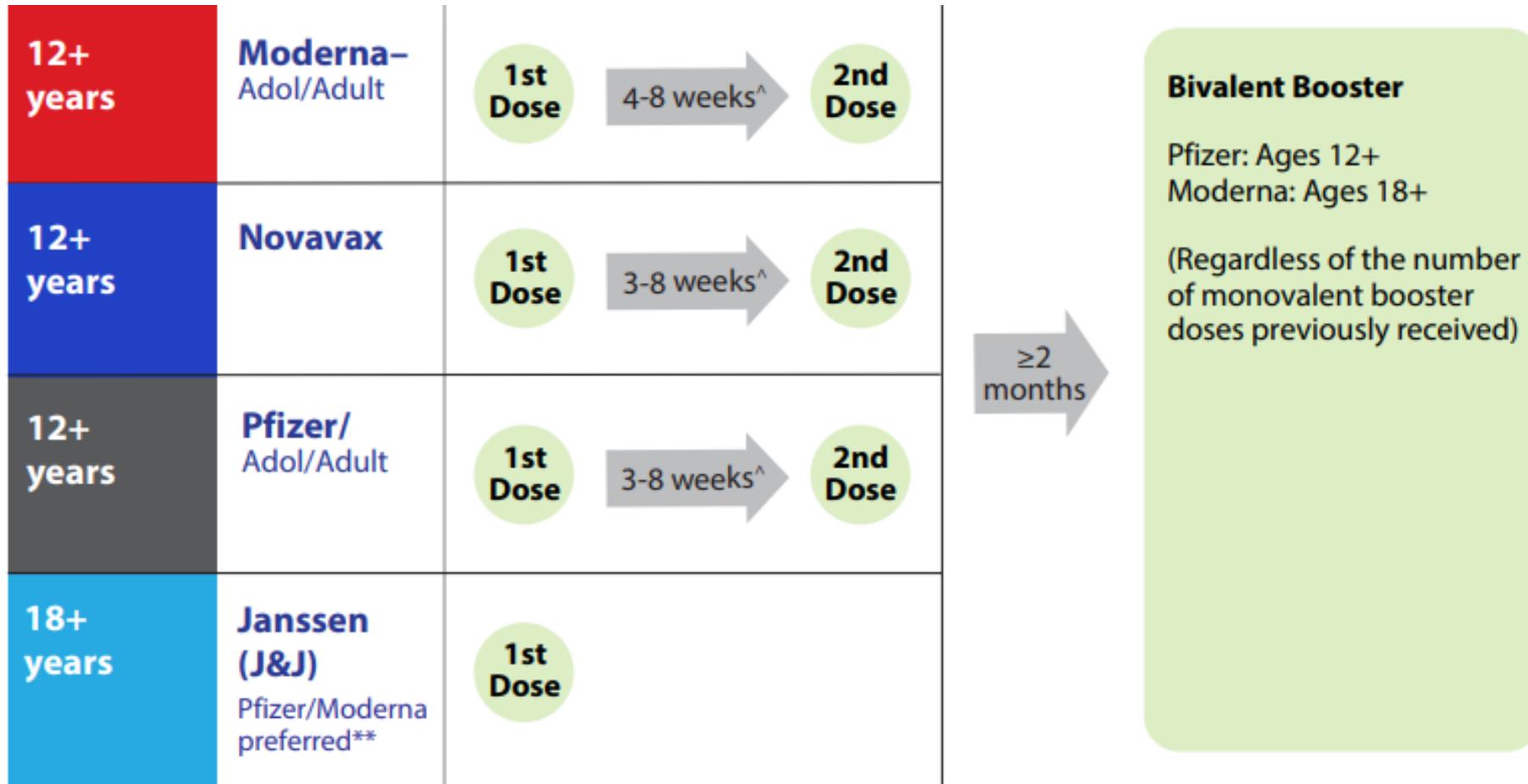
# Vaccination Schedule

## Routine Schedule

Age*	Vaccine	Primary Doses	Booster Dose
6 months– 4 years	Pfizer– Infant/Toddler	<p>1st Dose → 3-8 weeks<sup>^</sup> → 2nd Dose → ≥8 weeks → 3rd Dose</p>	
6 months– 5 years	Moderna– Infant/Toddler	<p>1st Dose → 4-8 weeks<sup>^</sup> → 2nd Dose</p>	
5–11 years	Pfizer– Pediatric	<p>1st Dose → 3-8 weeks<sup>^</sup> → 2nd Dose → ≥5 months →</p>	<b>Monovalent Booster</b> Pfizer 5-11 years
6–11 years	Moderna– Pediatric	<p>1st Dose → 4-8 weeks<sup>^</sup> → 2nd Dose</p>
