PROJECT TITLE: Designated car share parking zone in Isla Vista.
PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The project will allow a new car share parking zone to be established in accordance with the Isla Vista Master Plan Parking and Transit Policy 4 and Ordinance No. 4742. The proposed new location is currently unrestricted parking and would be designated as car share parking only. The currently designated location would be converted to unrestricted parking and thus result in zero net change of available parking in the area.

The project allows for a public safety activity designed to maintain a safe traveling condition of the highway facility as it was constructed.
