FY24 Omnibus Appropriations enacted in March that rejected proposed 30-percent spending cuts.

FY25 short-term funding Continuing Resolution enacted in September that did not include any spending reductions or partisan add-ons.

\$20 billion enacted to replenish FEMA's Disaster Relief Fund.

HUD action to implement Representative Carbajal's H.R. 6179, the Home for the Brave Act, to expand access to Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing.

Nutrition: Protections enacted for victims of Electronic Benefit Card theft.

Nutrition: \$1 billion enacted in March to prevent shortfall in Women, Infants, and Children Program

H.R. 8812, the Water Resources Development Act of 2024: \$4 million authorization for water/wastewater infrastructure for the Los Olivos Community Service District and report language to protect the Lower Mission Creek Project.

Enactment of S. 870 to reauthorize grants to local governments through the Assistance to Firefighters Grants Program, and the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response Grant Program

Direct funding:

- \$1 million for the Oasis Senior Center in the Senate FY25 Transportation, HUD Appropriations Bill.
- \$850,000 for the Lompoc Animal Shelter in the House FY25 Transportation, HUD Appropriations Bill.
- \$5.15 million from HUD for homelessness/affordable housing.
- \$2.35 million through Payments in Lieu of Taxes
- \$2 million in Department of Justice local law enforcement grants.

Legislation enacted to continue key programs with additional, longer-term action possible in the Lame Duck Session:

- Federally Qualified Health Centers.
- Behavioral Health/Opioids Programs extensions/expansion.
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families.
- Farm Bill nutrition programs.
- National Flood Insurance Program.
