RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SANTA BARBARA

ORDER PROCLAIMING ELECTION AND NOTICE OF ELECTION TO BE HELD IN SANTA BARBARA COUNTY ON JUNE 6, 2006, FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING WHETHER MISSION COUNTY SHALL BE CREATED, AND CONSOLIDATING THE ELECTION WITH THE STATEWIDE PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE HELD ON JUNE 6, 2006.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors received the Mission County Formation Review Commission's report on May 24, 2005; and

WHEREAS, under Section 23350 of the Government Code, the Board of Supervisors shall order and give proclamation and notice of an election to be held in the county on the next statewide primary or general election date not less than 74 days after receipt of the commission's determinations, for the purpose of determining whether the proposed county shall be created; and

WHEREAS, under Section 23350 of the Government Code, the election for the purpose of determining whether the proposed county shall be created may be consolidated with the next statewide primary or general election held not less than 74 days after receipt of the commission's determinations.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors does resolve as follows:

- 1. An election is hereby proclaimed to be held in Santa Barbara County on the sixth day of June, 2006, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of the County the question of whether the new County of Mission shall be formed.
- 2. The ballot shall contain the statement: "Shall the new County of Mission be formed?"
- 3. Electors are instructed to vote in the election as follows:

To vote on the question, fill in the oval in the voting square to the left of the word "Yes" to vote for the formation of the new County of Mission or to the left of the word "No" to vote against the formation of the new County of Mission.



You must mark your ballot selection with pencil or blue/black ink. All distinguishing marks or erasures are forbidden and make the ballot void.

If you tear, deface, or wrongly mark the ballot, return it and get another.

- 4. The boundaries of the proposed Mission County are described in EXHIBIT "A" attached hereto.
- 5. Santa Barbara County is the affected county within the meaning of the law dealing with the creation of new counties.
- 6. Request is hereby made for the submission of written arguments for and written arguments against the creation of Mission County. The board of supervisors of Santa Barbara County or any member or members of said board authorized by the board, any city council of a city within an affected county or any member or members of such council authorized by the council, any qualified elector entitled to vote at the election, any bona fide association of citizens, or any combination of qualified electors and associations may submit and file written arguments with the elections official of the Santa Barbara County for printing and distribution in the ballot pamphlet, in accordance with Section 9163 of the Elections Code. Arguments must be filed not later than the date fixed by the Santa Barbara County elections official under section 9163 of the Elections Code. Only one argument for and one argument against shall be selected and printed in the ballot pamphlet. Arguments shall not exceed 500 words in length and shall be accompanied by at least one and not more than three signatures.
- 7. The Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara does hereby order that the election called by this order be consolidated with the statewide primary election to be held throughout the County on June 6, 2006, that the proposition for creation of the proposed Mission County be placed on the same ballot as that provided for the statewide primary election, that the same precincts, polling places, election officers and facilities be used for these elections and that this election and the statewide primary election be held throughout the county in all respects as if there were only one election.
- 8. The Santa Barbara County Clerk-Recorder is hereby authorized and directed to cause this order, proclamation and notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of Santa Barbara at least once a week for three weeks, commencing not less than 70 days prior to the election.
