Dear Honorable Supervisors,

I have been a farmer in Carpinteria Valley my whole life and am currently growing 10 acres of cannabis on my previously named, Ever-Bloom Nursery. I also farm 60 acres of organic avocados at several other ranches. We have hundreds of employees who depend on the success of our operations. When you consider applying CUPs to all cannabis farms and creating changes to the odor standard applying to cannabis farms, I have to object to these changes.

We know that growing cannabis is treated differently than growing gerberas, which my company, Ever-Bloom grew for decades, unfortunately, Ever-Bloom was no longer able to sustain the cut flower market decline and I terminated that business. Given that the gerbera market fell out around 7 years ago, my family and I obtained the licenses and switched to growing cannabis using the same basic growing model at the same farm under the name Ednigma and other Licensees. Dutch farmers in our valley know how to grow plants and have long been leaders in local agriculture, supplying cut flowers across the country. That is why we have been able to stay here and plan for continuing to operate our farms with a new crop, because we know how to farm and operate farming businesses.

We have changed crops and made considerable investments to follow the conditions set forth in the county's cannabis ordinance. While complying with county rules, we also comply with state rules introduced with the legalization of cannabis. We base the future of our businesses on these sets of rules. Complying with these rules has been the foundation of our day-to-day operations since the County passed the cannabis ordinance. We are committed to being considerate neighbors and cooperative operators within the regulatory framework implemented by the county and approved by the California Coastal Commission. I'd like a commitment in return from regulatory agencies that we are all conducting ourselves in good faith and within a clear structure that's not subject to change based on perceived controversy surrounding the legal crop we choose to grow.

I also object to implications that avocado farming and cannabis farming cannot coexist. As stated above, I grow both. I've never considered them to be incompatible. Pesticide applicators were worried last year that they would not be able to work on Carpinteria avocado orchards. Through dialogue, they've found that cannabis operators are more than willing to accommodate neighbors. We have worked cooperatively with one another on issues as they have arisen, including most notably on the subject of pesticide spraying, where we have worked in close coordination to ensure that none of the pesticides being applied to avocado groves impact our cannabis crops. We have shown a willingness to address any and all reasonable concerns.

We take our commitment to the county and to the Carpinteria community very seriously and encourage the county to follow through with its strict standards so we no longer have to wonder if cannabis farms will be an accepted part of the local ag economy and tax base.
