RE: Support for Santa Maria Highway 101 6-Lane Widening Project

Dear Mr. Tavaglione:

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara requests that the California Transportation Commission (CTC) fund the ready-to-go Santa Maria Highway 101 six-lane project when the CTC allocates \$400 million in transportation revenues in early 2005.

The California Transportation Commission selected the Santa Maria 6-lane project as one of its priority projects in the 2004 STIP when it placed it in FY 2004/05 with \$20.6 million for construction.

The project has been waiting for an allocation of STIP funding since November 2002, nearly a year ahead of schedule, thanks to the work done by our project partner Caltrans to expeditiously complete the environmental studies and construction plans. Due to the State's fiscal crisis, the CTC has not been able to allocate funds to this and other projects in the State for two years. Thus, the \$400 million in additional funding presents a small window of opportunity to deliver a needed transportation project in the Santa Barbara region.

The project is supported both at the State and regional levels. It is funded by Santa Barbara County's share of the STIP, the Regional Improvement Program, as well as Caltrans' Interregional Improvement Program in the STIP. A companion project scheduled for construction in 2010, the widening of the Santa Maria River Bridge on Highway 101 to 6 lanes, is funded by SBCAG, the San Luis Obispo Council of Governments (SLOCOG) and Caltrans. These agencies recognize that the Highway 101 corridor is vital to the Central Coast and that the highway and bridge projects will have a significant impact on reducing existing and future congestion problems on Highway 101 in North Santa Barbara County.

We appreciate your prompt attention to this matter and look forward to working with you to make this project a reality. Please feel free to call me if you have any questions about this matter or if we can be of additional assistance to you.
