County Counsel

- OIL POLLUTION ACT OF 1990
 - General rule = strict liability
 - by "Responsible Party"
 - for <u>removal costs</u> & <u>damages</u>

National Contingency Plan:

- Pre-designated EPA or USCG "On-Scene Coordinator"
- "Unified Command System" framework: federal, state, local and Responsible Party
- "Joint Information Center: federal, state, local and Responsible Party

OIL POLLUTION ACT OF 1990

Claims Procedures:

- Responsible Party required to advertise procedures for presenting claims
- Claimant may present <u>partial claim</u> for interim damages without precluding further recovery
