Protect consumers and local businesses by:


- Creating a sustainable price scanner accuracy program with full-cost recovery.
- Creating a sustainable device inspection program by aligning device registration fees with current costs and state law.

Responsibilities - Scanners

The County Director of Weights and Measures is responsible for protecting consumers and businesses by verifying the accuracy of price scanning systems (scanners).







Justification - Scanners

2010 County-wide price verification survey results:

- State-wide overcharge average: 2.6%
- SB County Items overcharge rate: 7.0%
- Counties with price scanning ordinances have an overcharge average: 1.92%
