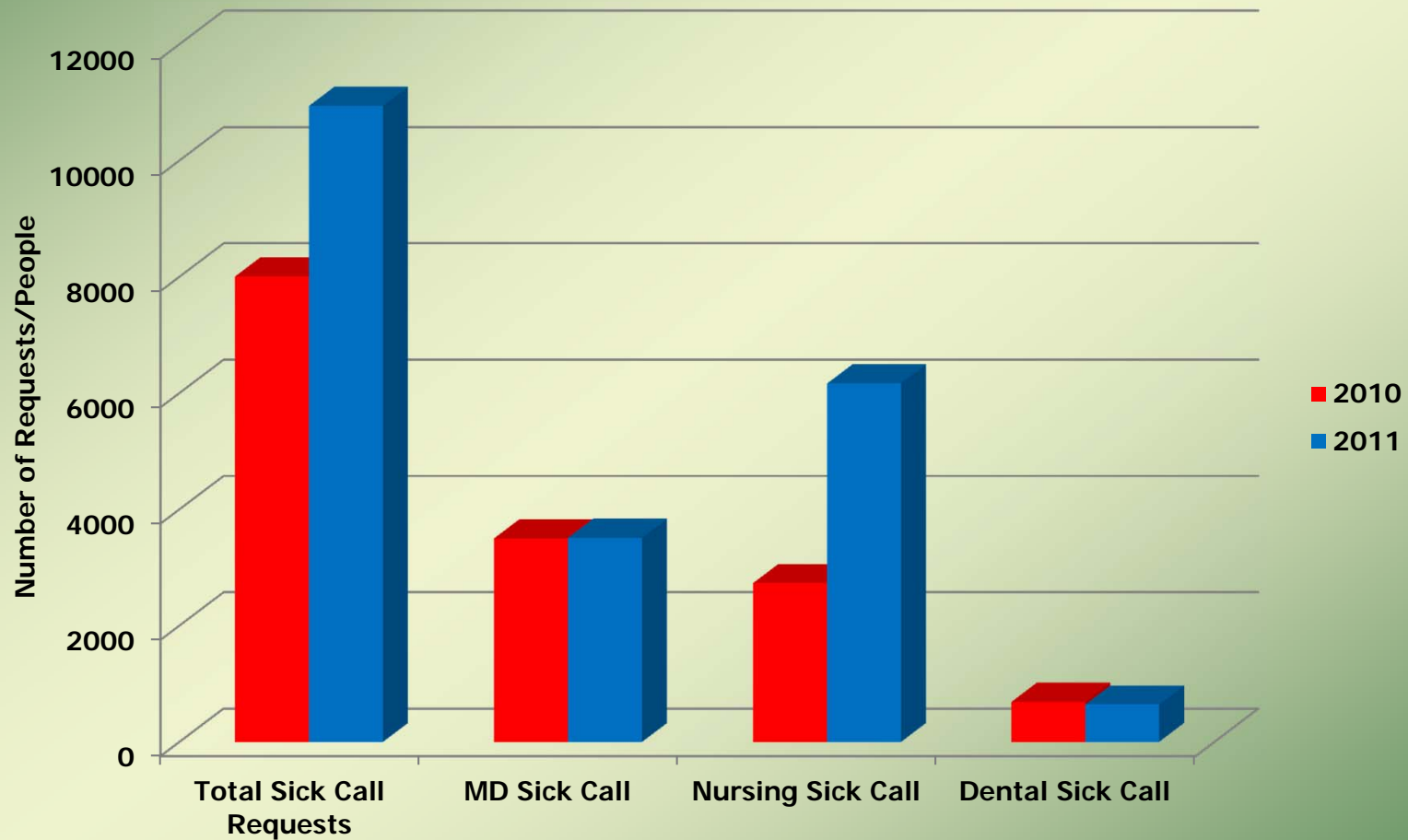

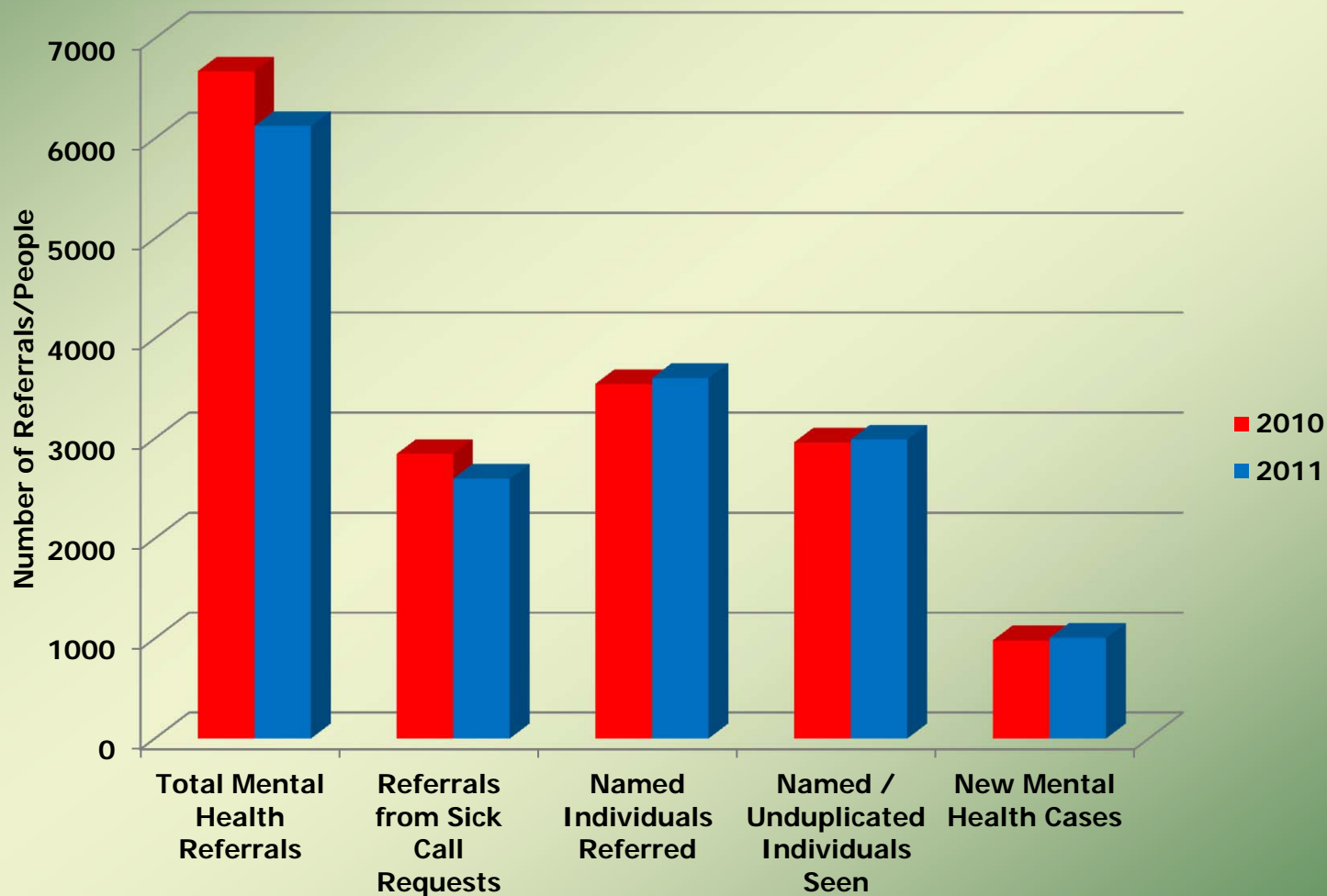


CORIZON MEDICAL SERVICES 2010-2011

Weekly Inmates of Continued Interest Meeting

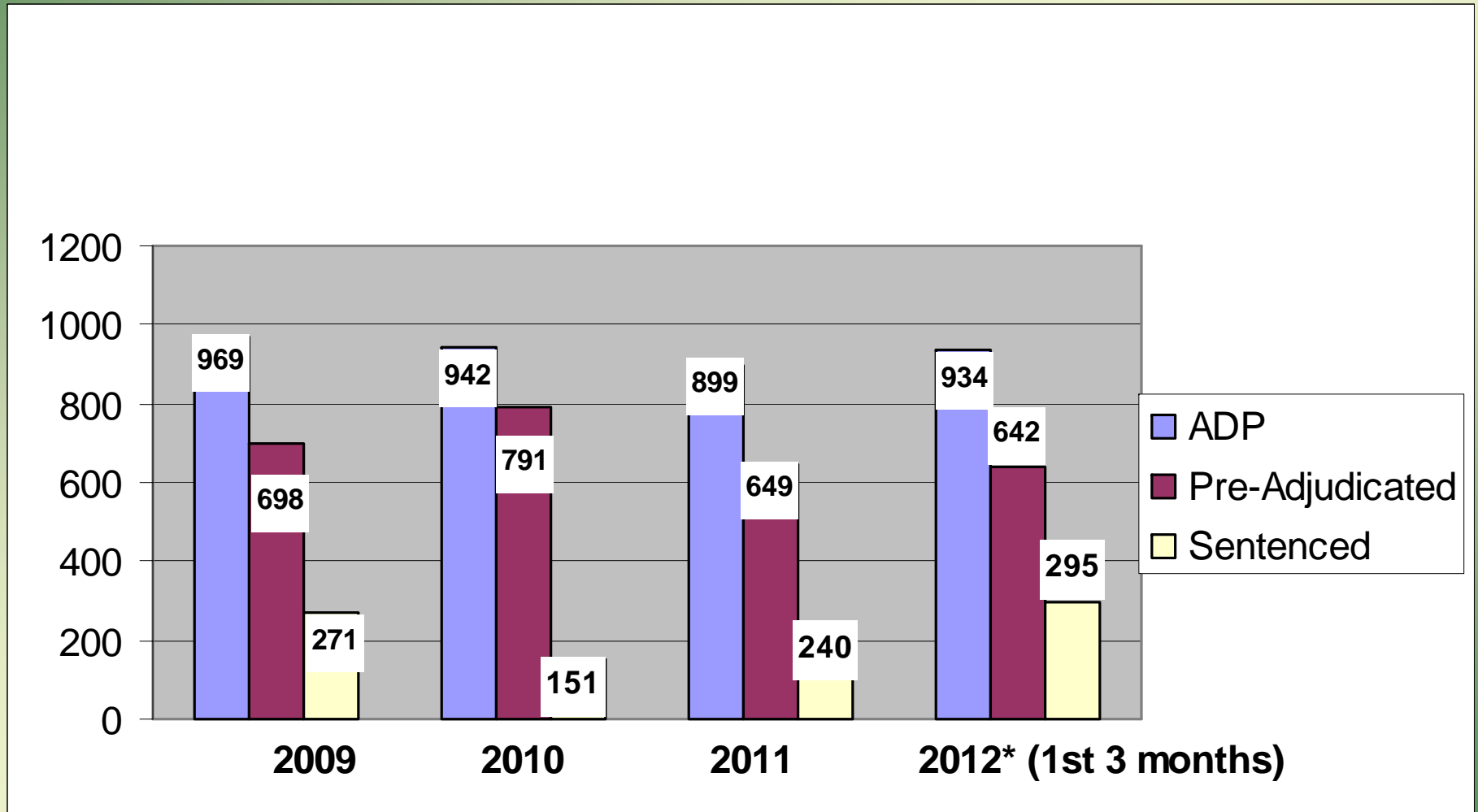
ADMHS /SBSO/Corizon collaboration
