Honorable Supervisors,

We are writing in regards to the COVID agenda item scheduled for the hearing of January 11, 2022. Please include the following concerns, questions, and recommendations in the official record.

The public remains confused with the ever-changing COVID recommendations.

JUST LAST WEEK:

Biden: There is no "federal solution" to beat COVID-19

CDC Director: "PCR tests are unreliable"

CDC Director: "Majority of COVID death are people that had 4 or more co-morbidities"

Fauci: "Quarantines can be cut to only 5 days"

The narrative seems to constantly shift after being routinely proven wrong. We recommend that the County immediately change course with regards to public mandates and recommendations for the general public. Lots of folks sick these past few weeks with the Omicron variant. We now know that the mask have almost no effect (many many studies now available) and the "vaccines" do not work as intended.

Instead of continuing to push masks and shots, please ask OUR health experts (Dr. Ansorg) for information on medications. Why is OUR approach at the County level limited to reporting the number of cases, number of deaths, and vaccination percentages. We believe that many of OUR health experts are aligned with big pharma. For reference, we offer the following questions:

Dear Chair Nelson and Supervisors:

The CLUE Criminal Justice Workgroup has reviewed Aaron Fisher's letter to the Santa Barbara County's legal counsel. We support the following actions:

Avoid Catastrophic Staffing Crisis and COVID Transmission. Nearly one quarter of the 725 current jail residents have tested positive during the outbreak that began in late December. As of January 5th, there were 94 active resident cases and 32 active staff cases. Now custodial and health care staff report 45% health and mental health care vacancies and at times have been unable to provide COVID vaccines to anyone in custody, despite a backlog of requests from jail residents.

1. Reduce Jail Numbers Safely. The recent Jail population's rise from 580 to 725 results from tripling the number of those accused of misdemeanors. Unsentenced low level accused jail residents, and those near the end of serving lengthy sentences, should be screened for release. Sheriff Brown should be encouraged to follow the practice of other counties and use his discretion for early release; thus far he has failed to act.
2. House mental health patients and those with substance abuse issues in appropriate alternatives. A recent Santa Barbara Grand Jury Report found under use of current community mental health crisis beds.
