Local sources & statistics



- County currently diverting 64% of its waste
- New construction is greatest challenge to maintaining diversion rate





 C&D accounts for 31% of all waste generated by County residents and businesses





How is C&D Generated?





- 96% comes from remodel and demolition
- 4% from new construction



- Economic incentives to separate waste
- Public/private partnerships
- Encouraged development of processing facilities



Current Challenges

- C&D represents large amount of waste in our community
- New development not required to recycle
 - Residents and businesses are
- Large projects can overwhelm recycling infrastructure

Recommended Process Improvements

Three Tiers of C&D Policies



County Policy Needs for the Future

- Update & StreamlineP&D documents
- Formally integrate
 Unscheduled Haulers
 into recycling system
- Protect diversion of C&D waste





Addressing Needs

- Three Tiers
 - Umbrella Diversion requirement of all C&D waste
 - Small Projects typically use permitted Unscheduled Haulers who will be required to recycle
 - □ Large Projects required to produce a "Solid Waste Management Plan" (SWMP)



Umbrella Diversion Requirement



- Proposed Inclusion in Chapter 17 of County Code
- Applied to all development

Small Projects



Defined

- Over 99% of all projects would be defined as "Small"
- □ Less than 350 tons of C&D waste is generated



Small Projects

- Current Situation
 - Most projects contract for waste removal
 - Companies that provide waste removal are permitted "Unscheduled Haulers"



Small Projects - Proposal



- Require Unscheduled Service Providers to recycle 50% of ALL waste
 - Majority of material is already recycled
 - Franchised haulers required to recycle
 - Formally integrating permittees into the recycling system



Small Projects - Proposal

- Policy Impacts
 - Unscheduled Haulers will
 - Recycle at their own facilities
 - Deliver material to recycling facilities
 - May create incentive for development of new recycling facilities





Large Projects



Defined

- □ Less than 1%
 - 30 projects per year
 - Generates more than 350 tons of C&D waste
- Considered significant impact: required to prepare SWMP (already required)



Large Projects - Proposal

- SWMP updated to:
 - Reflect current waste management system
 - Streamline information currently required
 - Capture large projects that have avoided recycling
 - Allow pre-planning to facilitate recycling



Steps Required to Attain Results



Next Steps

- Work with P&D to:
 - Update & simplify CEQA Threshold Guidelines
 - Update Standard Conditions
- Modify Chapter 17 to:
 - □ Require recycling of construction waste
 - □ Revise Unscheduled Hauler provisions to require recycling of 50% of waste collected



Recommendations

- Approve proposal
- Direct staff to return with specific proposed revisions
