Authorize and refer a Minute Order to the Elections division of the County Clerk-Recorder-Assessor to administer the special election of the Board of Retirement.

Summary Text:

This election is provided for by the County Employees Retirement Law (CERL) which controls the Santa Barbara County Employees' Retirement System. A vacancy in an elected seat on the Board of Retirement currently exists with more than 12 months remaining in the term. Administering Board elections is outside the normal scope of work for retirement system staff. However, the Elections Division of the County Clerk-Recorder-Assessor has procedures and experienced staff to efficiently administer the election. Therefore, the Board of Retirement has requested to outsource the administration of the election to the Elections Division of the County Clerk-Recorder-Assessor.

The Board of Retirement is composed of nine members with two alternates (four members appointed by the Board of Supervisors, one of which may be a member of the Board of Supervisors, two elected general members, one elected safety member, one elected retired member, and the County Treasurer as an ex-officio member. There are two elected alternates; to the safety and retired members). The special election is for the alternate retired member. Therefore ballots for one election will have to be polled, unless there is only one candidate for the position, in which case that candidate is declared the winner.

Fiscal Analysis:

The Retirement system will reimburse the County Clerk-Recorder-Assessor for its services.
