PROJECT DESCRIPTION: As part of the local guidelines of the Measure A one-half cent sales tax, the Board of Supervisors must adopt a Resolution annually indicating the Program of Projects for five fiscal years, and certifying the intent to allocate the required local discretionary funds to satisfy the "Maintenance of Efforts" provision of Measure A for FY 2014/2015. Also as part of the Measure A guidelines, the County must spend 10 percent of the funding on eligible Alternative Transportation costs.

Further, the approval of the Program of Projects will not create any unusual circumstances which would create a possibility that there would be a significant effect.


