Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve plans and specifications for Mission Canyon Road Storm Damage Repair, County Project No. 862397; First Supervisorial District, on file in the Public Works Department;
- b) Award the attached construction contract in the amount of \$206,410 to the lowest responsible bidder, Shaw Contracting, Inc., (a local vendor), subject to the provision of documents and certifications as set forth in the plans and specifications applicable to the project, as required under California law;
- c) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the attached construction contract;
- d) Authorize the Public Works Director or designee to approve change orders for a contingency amount up to \$20,641, for the construction of Mission Canyon Road Storm Damage Repair; County Project No. 862397; First Supervisorial District, for a total, not to exceed authorization of \$227,051; and
- e) Determine the project is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to 14 CCR 15301(c) (as the proposed project(s) consists of the operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that previously existing, including but not limited to existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities), and approve filing a Notice of Exemption on that basis.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda to award the construction of Mission Canyon Road Storm Damage Repair, County Project No. 862397 to the lowest responsible bidder, Shaw Contracting, Inc.

On Wednesday, October 4, 2017, 3 bids were opened for the Project. Shaw Contracting, Inc. submitted the lowest responsible bid in the amount of \$206,410.

The Project was bid in accordance with the Public Contract Code, which requires the award to go to the lowest responsible bidder. Public Works staff analyzed the bids and determined the low bid is responsive and responsible. Public Works recommends awarding this contract to Shaw Contracting, Inc.

Background:

Mission Canyon Road Storm Damage Repair is located immediately north of Paseo Del Acaso in the Mission Canyon community. The road suffered mudslides and an embankment failure which undermined the roadway, and caused the roadway surface to collapse. Due to the damage, one lane of the roadway was closed to all traffic. This roadway serves as the lone access for residents of the Mission Canyon community, immediately north of the damage site. This project will restore both directions of travel on Mission Canyon Road to full capacity.

On May 16, 2017, your Board approved the filing of the Notice of Exemption for storm damage sites from declared 2017 Storms. Storms in January and February 2017 caused extensive damage to the County’s transportation network. Fortunately, using County forces working continuously throughout these periods, most roads were able to remain open. However, work done to date has been limited to debris removal and emergency opening work. Permanent restoration work is still needed on 10 roads that have some type of traffic restrictions in place, including Mission Canyon, to repair damaged sites before they deteriorate further.

Narrative:

Funding will be determined on a project by project basis, and actual federal reimbursement rate is subject to approval by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. Based on advice from Public Works’ disaster recovery consultant, the Department is estimating recovery of 60% of project costs. Should a higher reimbursement rate be achieved, the General Funds needed would be less. Funding will be budgeted in the Dept.054, Fund 0016, Org Unit 0500, Account LI 7510.
