SUBJECT: South Coast Community Hazardous Waste Collection Center Operation Contract

First, Second and Third Supervisorial Districts

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Approve and execute:

A. The attached Agreement with the University of California at Santa Barbara for the operation of the Community Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center at the Environmental Health and Safety Hazardous Waste Facility, for the period July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003, in the not-to-exceed amount of \$339,587;

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The Recommendations are primarily aligned with a safe and healthy community in which to live, work, and visit.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

To reduce the quantity of improperly discarded hazardous materials from households and small businesses, the County has supported the development and operation of the Community Hazardous Waste Collection Center. A unique public/private partnership between the County of Santa Barbara, the University of California Santa Barbara, (UCSB), and the Community Environmental Council, Inc. (CEC) has made the operation of the Community Hazardous Waste Collection Center possible. The advantage of this facility is

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that it provides residents and businesses a convenient way to safely dispose of unwanted hazardous waste on a weekly basis.

As a part of the County of Santa Barbara's ongoing support of the operation of a CHWCC, negotiations with UCSB for the use of their Environmental Health and Safety (EH&S) Hazardous Waste Facility resulted in the Agreement approved by the Board of Supervisors on July 20, 1993. The County's CHWCC opened October 1, 1993 and serves the South Coast community and small quantity generators on weekends. Small quantity generators (businesses who generate less than 27 gallons or 220 pounds per month) are required to schedule appointments on Fridays for acceptance of their hazardous waste. Residents from the unincorporated communities of the Goleta Valley, Montecito, Summerland, Carpinteria Valley and the Cities of Santa Barbara and Goleta may use the facility.

UCSB's Operation Contract provides reimbursement to UCSB for expenses associated with the use of the facility. The agreement provides for the following; the annual facility use fee; salaries for four UCSB facility employees to handle the incoming hazardous waste; all packaging materials and supplies to be used in storing, transporting and/or recycling and disposal of the county-generated HHW; ongoing maintenance of the waste tracking program; emergency response supplies and storage; and various operating equipment.

In the past year capacity at the CHWCC has reached its maximum. The County, CEC, and UCSB have been making adjustments to more efficiently use the facility as well as initiating the evaluation of future expansion of the facility. It is the County's intent to continue to include this important facility in all future plans for a county-wide hazardous waste collection program.

Mandates and Service Levels:

Operation of a CHWCC is recommended in the County's Household Hazardous Waste Element (HHWE) which was prepared in order to comply with the California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 (Public Resources Code, Title 14, Division 7) mandates and regulation. Your Board adopted the HHWE on January 28, 1992.

There is no change in the service level provided by this program.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

There are no new facilities associated with the continued management of the community household hazardous waste collection center.

This new agreement will provide operational funds for the fiscal year 2002/03. Funds for the 2002/03 fiscal year agreement have been appropriated in the recommended 2002/03 Solid Waste and Utilities Division budget, from a program fee assessed on solid waste collection bills.
