- A. Approve plans and specifications for Construction of the 2007 Paving Project at the Tajiguas Landfill, County Project No. 828721; and
- B. Award the construction contract in the amount of \$536,364.00 to the lowest responsible bidder, Union Asphalt, Inc. (a local vendor), subject to the provisions of documents and certification, as set forth in the plans and specifications applicable to the project, as required under California Law: and
- C. Authorize the Chair to execute the construction contract upon return of the Contractor's executed contract documents and the approval of County Counsel, Auditor Controller and Risk Manager or their authorized representatives: and
- D. Approve contingency fund in the amount of \$39,318.20 for Construction of the 2007 Paving Project at the Tajiguas Landfill, County Project No. 828721.

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## Summary Text:

The main administration trailers and fueling facilities at the Tajiguas Landfill will be relocated this summer to allow for the next phase, Phase 2, of the landfill expansion. The parking and internal roadway will need to be paved to provide all weather access. Phase 2 of the landfill expansion will also require the removal of the existing paved road to the top deck waste filling area. An alternate access road will need to be constructed and paved to replace it. Both of these paving projects will need to be completed prior to winter rains in fiscal year 2007/08.

# Background:

The Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the Tajiguas Landfill Expansion Project was certified by the Board of Supervisors on August 13, 2002. This project is part of a multi phased expansion at the Tajiguas Landfill included in the Resource Recovery & Waste Management Revised Solid Waste Facilities Permit as issued in May of 2003. As part of the planned expansion it is necessary to realign access roads and relocate the onsite facilities. This project is consistent with the project description analyzed in the EIR and Your Board authorized the advertisement of this project on May 15, 2007.
