

PROTEST AGAINST ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE APPLICATION

I hereby protest the issuance of a license under the Alcoholic Beverage Control Act to:

Santa Ynez Band of Mission Indians

For premises at:

on the grounds that:

1. The premises is located within the immediate vicinity of a school, church, hospital, or children's playground and the normal operation of the licenses premises would interfere with their functions. Three elementary schools, a high school and the Santa Ynez Valley YMCA are all located within approximately 0.5 miles of the subject property. Expanding sales of alcohol to additional areas of the property where age verification is more difficult to control may lead to increased accessibility of alcohol to minors and underage drinking.
2. Issuance of the license would result in or add to undue concentration of licenses. Increasing the area of sales to include those areas set aside for special events will likely result in an overall increase of alcohol sales in an area which already has a high concentration of licenses.
3. Issuance of the license to the premises would tend to create a law enforcement problem, or aggravate an existing police problem. The property is showing a trend of increased need for law enforcement response. In 2008, 149 citations were issued at the subject property. In 2009, this number increased to 154, and in the first five months of 2010, 124 citations have already been issued. These figures represent only the citations issued, not calls made. These figures do not include other calls for services such as fire or emergency medical services. (Note: Summary crime statistics received from the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Department are attached. Names of individuals have been redacted from the attached reports and are indicated by the solid black pen line.)
