Dear Supervisors,

I was alarmed to learn that ExxonMobil and its Plains "All-American" pipeline partner seek to restart three offshore oil platforms on the Gaviota Coast which have been shut down since the 2015 Refugio oil disaster.

Plains wants to build a new 123-mile pipeline as an alternative to the one that burst, bulldozing a 100 foot corridor along the entire route, crossing three rivers, three counties and enabling Exxon's offshore production for decades to come.

I am concerned about all the many environmental risks involved in this proposal. I urge you to examine these closely and come to a decision that takes into account the health and safety of the residents and habitats that would be affected by the construction of this pipeline. It is your responsibility to protect the communities that elected you.
