- 1) Approve Budget Revision Request #2007064 for Rural Crime grant funding.
- 2) Adopt a HR Resolution Effective November 5, 2007, adding one (1.0) FTE Sheriff's Deputy Trainee/Deputy position (Class 6904-6905; Range 5572-5972; \$3,907-\$5,822) to the Sheriff's Department.

Summary Text:

The District Attorney and the Sheriff's Department have applied for and received a \$150,000 grant from the State of California Office of Emergency Services (OES) for Rural Crime Prevention. The Sheriff's portion of the grant totals \$123,105 and funds a full-time deputy to focus on rural crime issues in the County. This board letter presents the Sheriff's portion of the grant in the form of a HR resolution to add the position to the department and a budget revision recognizing the revenue and appropriating the expense. The District Attorney's portion was included in the FY2007-08 Budget presentation as a final budget adjustment and has already been adopted.

Background:

The FY2007-08 Rural Crime grant is a continuation from a grant received in FY2006-07 to focus resources on rural crime in Santa Barbara County. The primary duties of the Sheriff's Deputy will be to investigate and review all reported Rural Crimes in the County of Santa Barbara, coordinate all investigative activities with the other four counties of the Central Coast Rural Crime Prevention Program, conduct arrests of those persons who commit Rural Crime, and to obtain and serve search warrants, as needed, to apprehend Rural Crime criminals.

Narrative:

BRR #2007064 recognizes the revenue from the grant and allocates \$115,024 to salaries and benefits for the additional Deputy Sheriff position as well as \$1,337 for training, \$744 for regional meeting expense and \$6,000 for vehicle operations.

Staffing Impacts: This Board letter adds one deputy sheriff position to the department, funded by the Rural Crime grant. It is understood that if the grant goes away or reduces below the level of the annual salary of a Deputy Sheriff, the position will be removed from the department.
