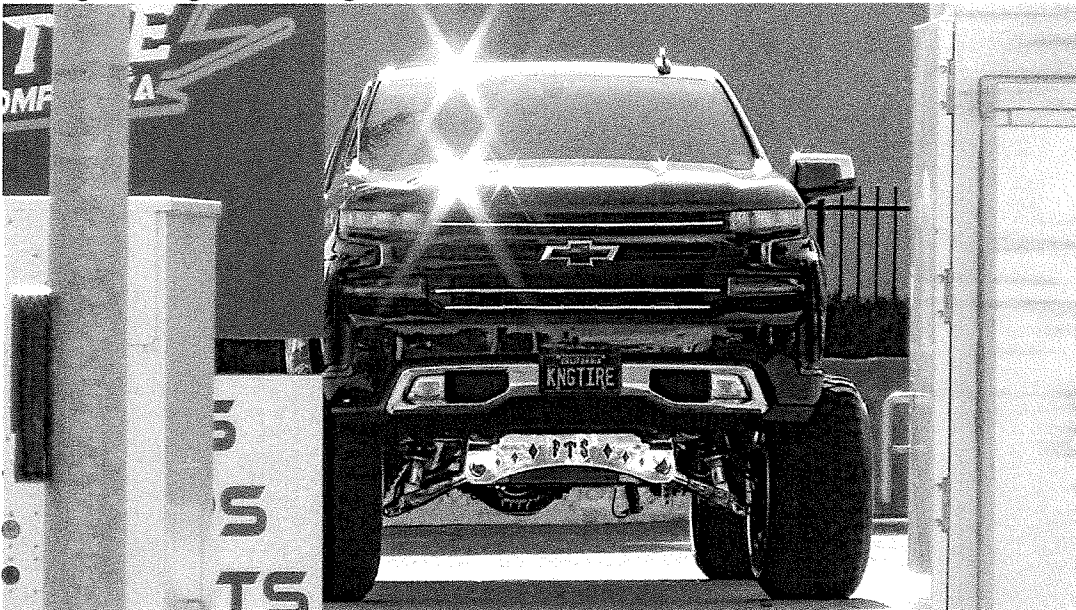

Dear Pink Door Families,

We were notified that an individual in Pink Door tested positive for COVID on Friday night, May, 13th. The individual was last in Turquoise Door on Friday.

Per our current COVID guidance based on revised guidance from Santa Barbara County Public Health Dept for Childcare on 2/1/22: Unvaccinated/vaccinated children may continue to attend the program if they get tested twice for COVID-19

Once as soon as feasible after notification AND
Once on or after 5 days from contact.

No testing = 10 days quarantine

Given this...we are asking that you test your child before drop off on Monday, May 16h with an antigen test (we have tests available at the Center if needed).

A negative antigen test must also be presented before drop off on Thursday, May 19th (5+ days from contact).

Sending our best to the affected individual and wishes for a speedy recovery.
