Categorical Exemption Emergency Project Declared Emergency

The Tajiguas Landfill is permitted under Solid Waste Facility Permit 42-AA-0015 and has been analyzed under CEQA in 01-EIR-05 certified by the Board of Supervisors on August 13, 2002 and several CEQA Guidelines 15162 determinations, 15164 addendums and subsequent EIRs. Use of

infrastructure to support operation of the landfill including water storage is included in those environmental documents. CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Class 1 exemption) consists of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former use. The key consideration is whether the project involves negligible or no expansion of use.

Consistent with CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 the Ridgeline Tank Rehabilitation Phase 2 project would repair existing water tanks used at the Tajiguas Landfill that provide storage for water from water supply wells, and non-potable water collected by the landfill's groundwater interceptor trench. The tanks are subject to corrosion and damage due to weather and periodic maintenance is required to extend the service life of the tanks. The repair work would not result in any change or expansion of the use. The tanks would be accessed by existing roads and no additional ground disturbance would occurs. Staging for the repair activities would occur immediately adjacent to the tanks in previously graded and disturbed areas.

The proposed project does not involve unusual circumstances, including future activities, resulting in or which might reasonably result in significant impacts which threaten the environment. The exceptions to the categorical exemptions pursuant to Section 15300.2 of the State CEQA Guidelines are:

(a) Location. Classes 3, 4, 5, 6, and 11 are qualified by consideration of where the project is to be located – a project that is ordinarily insignificant in its impact on the environment may in a particularly sensitive environment be significant. Therefore, these classes are considered to apply all instances, except where the project may impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped, and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies.

The project is within the scope of a Class 1 exemption; therefore, this exception does not apply.

(b) Cumulative Impact. All exemptions for these classes are inapplicable when the cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time is significant.

No other tank repair projects are proposed; therefore, this exception does not apply.

(c) Significant Effect. A categorical exemption shall not be used for an activity where there is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Maintenance activities at the Tajiguas Landfill are covered under a Habitat Conservation Plan and Incidental Take Permit issued by the US Fish and Wildlife Service. The tank repairs are in upland areas distant from stormwater features where California red-legged

frog and southwestern pond turtles have historically been observed. However, California red-legged frogs can disperse through upland areas (primarily at night, during wet weather). Compensatory mitigation has been required as a part of the HCP/ITP and repair activities would be required to comply with HCP/ITP avoidance and minimization measures. Therefore, this exception does not apply.

(d) Scenic Highways. A categorical exemption shall not be used for a project which may result in damage to scenic resources, including but not limited to, trees, historic buildings, rock outcroppings, or similar resources, within a highway officially designated as a state scenic highway. This does not apply to improvements which are required as mitigation by an adopted negative declaration or certified EIR.

U.S. 101 in the vicinity of the Landfill is designated as a Scenic Highway. However, the repair work is on existing tanks and would not result in any new damage to scenic or historic resources. Therefore, this exception does not apply.

(e) Hazardous Waste Sites. A categorical exemption shall not be used for a project located on a site which is included on any list compiled pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

The tanks subject to the repair work are located on the Tajiguas Landfill property which includes a Class III municipal solid waste landfill. The tanks are located on ridgelines outside of the permitted waste footprint. The landfill is not listed as a hazardous waste site. Therefore, this exception does not apply.

(f) Historical Resources. A categorical exemption shall not be used for a project which may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.

The project involves repairs at existing tank sites. No new ground disturbance is proposed. Therefore, this exception does not apply.

Each project applicant shall remit to the county clerk the environmental filing fee before or at the time of filing a Notice of Determination (Pub. Resources Code, § 21152; Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subdivision (d); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5). Without the appropriate fee, statutory or categorical exemption, or a valid No Effect Determination issued by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), the Notice of Determination is not operative, vested, or final, and shall not be accepted by the county clerk.

COUNTY DOCUMENTARY HANDLING FEE

The county clerk may charge a documentary handling fee of fifty dollars (\$50) per filing in addition to the environmental filing fee (Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subd. (e); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5, subd. (g)(1)). A county board of supervisors shall have the authority to increase or decrease the fee or charge, that is otherwise authorized to be levied by another provision of law, in the amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of providing any product or service or the cost of enforcing any regulation for which the fee or charge is levied (Gov. Code, § 54985, subd. (a)).

Within 30 days after the end of each month in which the environmental filing fees are collected, each county shall summarize and record the amount collected on the monthly State of California Form No. CA25 (TC31) and remit the amount collected to the State Treasurer. Identify the remittance on Form No. CA25 as "Environmental Document Filing Fees" per Fish and Game Code section 711.4.

The county clerk shall mail the following documents to CDFW on a monthly basis:

If this information is contained on the cash receipt filed with CDFW under California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 753.5, subdivision (e)(6), no additional information is required.

DOCUMENT RETENTION

The county shall retain two copies of the cash receipt (for lead agency and county clerk) and a copy of all documents described above for at least 12 months.

RECEIPT NUMBER

- # The first two digits automatically populate by making the appropriate selection in the County/State Agency of Filing drop down menu.
- # The next eight digits automatically populate when a date is entered.
- # The last three digits correspond with the sequential order of issuance for each calendar year. For example, the first receipt number issued on January 1 should end in 001. If a county issued 252 receipts for the year ending on December 31, the last receipt number should end in 252.
