





Goals of an Isla Vista Rental Inspection Pilot Program

- Improved health and safety of Isla Vista residents.
- Help ensure safe, habitable living conditions of current rental housing stock in Isla Vista.
- Increased accountability for landlords and property owners.
- Reduction of emergency interventions.
- Support young, low-income tenants.
- Isla Vista-specific pilot program. No intention to expand beyond Isla Vista.



Background


- UC Santa Barbara's failure to meet its housing goals outlined in its 2010 Long Range Development Plan
- March 2024: Settlement reached with UC Santa Barbara
 - \$3.7 million payment to County to fund projects and programs that address Isla Vista community needs.
 - 3,500 new student beds
 - Up to 1,874 faculty and staff units
- Extensive community outreach to assess Isla Vista's most pressing needs. Safe housing rose to top.
- July 2024: Board unanimously approved project list with settlement funds, including a proactive rental inspection pilot program.

Isla Vista At A Glance


- One of the most densely populated areas in the entire country

- 72% poverty rate






Housing Safety Complaints

- Presence of mold
- Fences in disrepair along bluffs
- Rodents/insects
- Lack of smoke detectors
- No heat
- Exposed electrical wiring
- And more...











Recommended Actions

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Receive and file this report on the unsafe and substandard housing conditions of rental housing units in the community of Isla Vista and discuss a potential pilot rental housing inspection program;
- Direct the Planning and Development Department to prepare an ordinance to create and implement an Isla Vista Rental Housing Inspection Pilot Program;
- Determine that this report does not constitute a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15378(b)(5); and
