Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

A. Authorize the Chief Probation Officer to accept the 2007 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG), in the amount of \$126,747 for the grant period of 10/1/06-9/30/10 and the Office of Emergency Services (OES) Grant in the amount of \$157,442 for fiscal year 2007/08.

Summary Text:

Given its mid-state locale, rendering it accessible to the Bay Area, Los Angeles, and San Diego, Santa Barbara County has been a hub for major vendor operations. The County is affluent, and in many areas, it is largely rural with a predominantly agricultural base in the North County. The aforementioned demographics all contribute to successful major vendor operations. Within Santa Barbara County there continues to be a serious problem with

methamphetamine, cocaine, and marijuana abuse. Referrals for treatment continue to demonstrate that methamphetamine is the primary drug of use countywide. Santa Barbara County's Anti-Drug Abuse Steering Committee also recognizes that there is a correlation between illegal substance abuse and gang related activity.

During the period covered by the grant, the Santa Barbara County Anti-Drug Abuse project will use a multi-jurisdictional Narcotic Task Force and prosecution component to target major narcotic vendors operating in or trafficking through our county. The project will also focus on probation violators, specifically, probationers who violate their probation grants due to narcotic use or sales, and those on probation for narcotic related offenses. By targeting these areas, the project expects to positively impact the community by driving drug traffickers from Santa Barbara County, working to enforce Court orders, and decreasing violent crimes, with a focus on gang-related violent and narcotic crimes. In order to increase the efficiency of the anti-drug abuse efforts of our county, our project will serve as the lead agency in coordinating interjurisdictional meetings, which will include all narcotic units operating in Santa Barbara County.

Background:

Santa Barbara County has received Byrne Formula Grant funding for 17 years. In an effort to streamline justice funding and grant administration, the US Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs created the Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG). The 2007 JAG funds combined with funds from the California State Office of Emergency Services (OES) will be used to support the Santa Barbara Regional Narcotics Enforcement Team (SBRNET).

The County Law Enforcement Chiefs and the Alcohol Drug Program Administrator are the grants' required Steering Committee responsible for determining how these funds available to Santa Barbara County are utilized.

The agencies involved in the grants include the Santa Barbara County Probation Department, the Santa Barbara County District Attorney's Office, the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Department, the Santa Barbara Police Department, the Lompoc Police Department, the Santa Maria Police Department and the Guadalupe Police Department. The objectives of these grants remain unchanged.

As stated in previous Board Letters, SBRNET is a collaborative effort between all local law enforcement agencies to apply certain strategies designed to reduce the flow of narcotics through our county. The project uses searches, buy-bust operations, and street sweeps to accomplish the desired reduction of narcotics. It targets both street level dealers and major vendors operating within Santa Barbara County.

Performance Measure:

Over 50 performance measures are tracked for the grants including both output and outcome measures. The following are a few of the key measures.

- At least 40 probation referrals or random compliance searches will be conducted.
- 100% of those arrested as part of this project will be successfully prosecuted.
- 100% of methamphetamine lab investigations in Santa Barbara County or its adjacent counties will have involved the Santa Barbara Regional Narcotic Enforcement Team.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

Budgeted:

JAG provides \$126,747 and OES provides for \$157,442

The grants have no match requirement and do not cause the General Fund contribution to increase.

Narrative:

The budget supports the stated goals and objectives offsetting the costs associated with providing for one full time equivalent (FTE) Deputy District Attorney, one FTE Deputy Probation Officer, one Santa Barbara Police Department Officer, one Santa Barbara Sheriff's Office Detective and one FTE Office Assistant Senior assigned to SBRNET. The Santa Maria Police Department will apply their allocated funds to purchase needed equipment; fifty X26 Black Tasers with holsters and digital power magazines, one hundred 25' XP cartridges, and one data download port. Law enforcement officers from the Santa Maria Police Department and Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement are "donated" to the project by their respective agency.

The recommendation will not result in an increase or decrease or FET or legal positions.

This Agreement is made and entered into this first day of July, 2007, by and between The COUNTY of Santa Barbara, acting by and through its County Administrator, hereinafter referred to as COUNTY, and the CITY of Santa Maria, acting by and through its City Administrator, hereinafter referred to as CITY, both of Santa Barbara County, State of California, witnesseth:

WHEREAS, this agreement is made in anticipation of an award of funds under the JAG Program for the Santa Barbara Regional Narcotic Enforcement Team (SBRNET) Program, and IF such grant is awarded: and,

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the CITY, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions hereunder, shall make that performance or those payments from current revenues legally available to that party: and,

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the CITY finds that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interests of both parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions under this Agreement: and,

WHEREAS, the COUNTY agrees to provide the CITY \$40,323 from the JAG award for the Santa Barbara Regional Narcotic Enforcement Team (SBRNET) Program: and,

WHEREAS, the CITY and COUNTY believe it to be in their best interests to reallocate the JAG funds: and,

WHEREAS, the COUNTY serve as the applicant and will be responsible for the administration of the joint funds; monitoring the award; submitting reports including performance measure and program assessment data; and providing ongoing assistance to any sub recipients of the funds.

NOW THEREFORE, the COUNTY and CITY agree as follows:

Section 1.

COUNTY agrees to pay CITY a total of \$40,323 of JAG funds.

Section 2.

COUNTY agrees to use \$66,593 for the SBRNET Program for FY 2007-08.

Section 4.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against CITY other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the California Tort Claims Act.

Section 5.

Each party to this Agreement will be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this Agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by the other party.

Section 6.

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement.

Section 7.

By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those set out herein; further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.
