# Cuyama Pool Parks Operating Costs Assumptions

- Annual 2009-10 and ongoing costs based upon 365 days of maintenance
- Pool open 150 days, 7 days/week, 8 hours daily
- Other 7 months requires 4 hours minimum daily maintenance
  - Pools cannot be drained
  - Water, circulation pumps, and chemicals must cycle daily
  - Operator requires pool certification
- Costs Do Not Include Potential for In-kind and or Nonprofit Assistance as None Have Been Secured to Date.
