 County Service Areas (CSA) provide streetlighting and other services

Installed by development

Electric companies own and maintain streetlights

CSA pays for energy and maintenance cost

Revenue

 Generated from property tax, benefit assessments, and benefit zones

 Property tax revenue increases with greater property values

 Benefit assessment increases require Prop 218 election

 Fund Balance in excess of \$350,000 and remaining constant or unchanged.

No Proposed Change in Rates

• \$8 per year per Resident

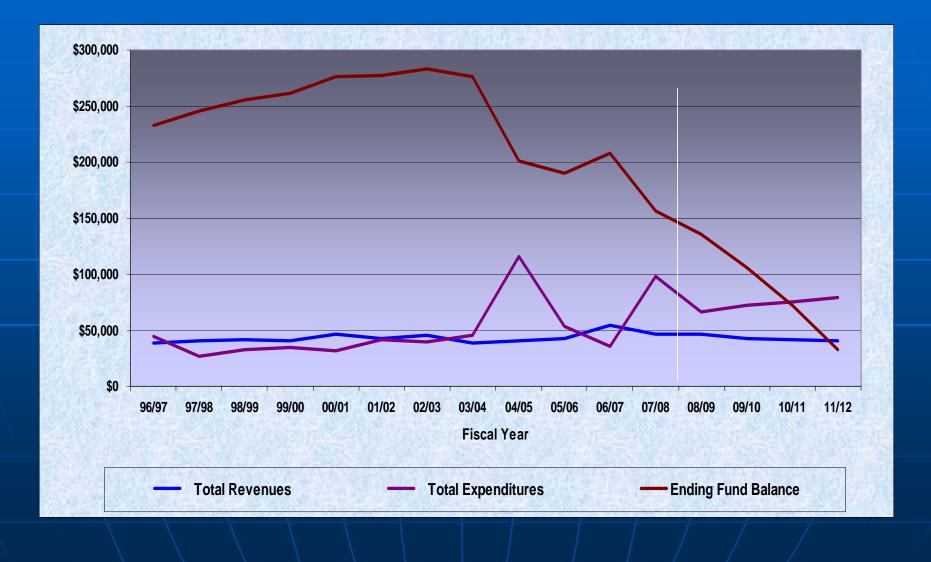
Balanced Budget for Lighting and unbalanced overall:

	CSA 31	Street Lighting
Revenue	\$46,400	\$36,100
Expenses	\$63,635	\$36,100

Fund Balance about \$156,000 and decreasing.

Fund Balance anticipated to be depleted by 2013.

Proposed 2008-2009 Rates for No Co Lighting District

Rate Reduction Proposed in 2008-2009

\$0 per year per parcel within CSA 5 (Previously \$14.73 for Residential)

- Balanced Budget:
 - Revenues \$451,755
 - Expenses
 \$406,098 annual

\$173,550 one time return to General Fund

Fund Balance in excess of \$470,000 and increasing.
