Recommended Action(s):

That the Board of Supervisors appoint a two member ad hoc committee to work on future policies for maintaining public safety and addressing the fiscal impacts for Halloween week activities in Isla Vista.

Summary:

For the past decade and a half the County has experienced extraordinary costs, public safety and public health hazards, and the diminution of the availability of public safety forces for deployment in other parts of the County during Halloween week activities in Isla Vista. It is estimated that this year's activities drew over 15,000 individuals from outside the community as well as substantial parts of the local student population from local colleges and universities and high schools. Moreover, 80% of the arrests are individuals from outside the community. Alcoholic poisoning, public health hazards and pressure on the Goleta Valley Cottage Hospital are a major concern. Reportedly, many college students from throughout California attended the various activities, despite a large education campaign, provision of alternate activities, and warnings about arrests and fines.

Given that a positive approach has failed to result in substantial curtailment it is important for elected representatives in the County to discuss alternatives with the Chancellor, the President of the Community College and perhaps leaders of other educational institutions which have been unable to get their respective students to refrain voluntarily from attending these activities.

Once the sub-committee has met with these public officials, it will report back to the Board with the result and recommended actions.
