This is a copy of an email I sent to the SB Co. Planning Department on September 13: The recent article in the Montecito Journal by The Project for Resilient Communities on the six debris nets read like a paid advertisement. Rather than a success, the nets represent a failure.

The nets were put in place due to good intentions and a wealthy donor pool rather than evidence that they would prevent disaster. At a cost of millions, a single net captured "small to moderate sized-rock debris with some vegetative material" as described by the geologist for the project. Without a net most of that debris would have ended up in the Randall Rd. debris basin and been trucked away last January. Instead that debris remains in San Ysidro Canyon to be redistributed in the area of the net as promised by TPRC.

Unfortunately that is not a feasible solution. I have scrambled up local creek beds in the years since the debris flow, noting changes and recovery of vegetation, amphibians and insects. Following the heavy rains of January 2023 that access is no longer available. The pools in the netted creeks are now deeper, the boulders more exposed and the sides of the creek bed steeper and higher. The only place debris from the San Ysidro or any other net could be redistributed adjacent to a net is on top of shrub dominated native vegetation.

The nets were a privately funded project on private properties. Delaying their removal beyond October of this year would likely result in increased cost, while seeking public financial assistance is not an option. That money would be better spent on the continuing recovery of Gibraltar Road and the Romero fire road.
