


#### Case Rate per 100k People






#### Comparing Case Rate by Vaccination Status, 9/9

Daily Case Rate of Unvaccinated vs Vaccinated in Santa Barbara County








## Hospital Capacity, 9/19

#### Pfizer Booster Shot

- > FDA advisory panel voted to recommend Pfizer booster shot for:
  - 65 years and older; or
  - High risk of severe COVID-19
- > Panel supported authorization for:
  - Healthcare workers
  - Others at high risk of occupational coronavirus exposure
- ➤ Booster programs can begin **after** FDA approval and CDC issue clinical guidance

FACT. Researchers took no safety shortcuts.

Large studies show the vaccine is safe.



**FACT.** The vaccine helps your body produce antibodies but cannot change your DNA.



FACT. The vaccine cannot give you COVID-19 because it does not contain a live virus strain.



FACT. It does not have egg proteins and can be given to people with egg allergies.



The vaccine can cause mild side effects that resolve in a few days.



There is no evidence that the vaccine causes infertility.
