WHEREAS, Dr. Wynelle Chase was recognized as the state recipient of the Association of California School Administrators Human Resources Administrator of the Year Award in 2001 for her outstanding service and leadership to educators throughout the State of California; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Wynelle Chase has the highest respect from her colleagues and peers in the educational field and truly deserves to be recognized for her extraordinary work.
