

Honorable Members of the Board of Supervisors:

The Gray Panthers Santa Barbara Network (GPSBN) feels strongly that the County must include the phasing out of oil and gas projects and the denying of new oil and gas projects in the Climate Action Plan.

GPSBN advocates for older adults in the County. One of our policies states: "Support a clean and sustainable environment and access to life-sustaining systems for all." Your action last August to reduce greenhouse gas emissions was a step in the right direction. However, the additional step of phasing out oil and gas projects also is necessary.

Among the many harmful aspects of such projects, diesel trucks and gas-burning steam generators emit health-damaging air pollution which are known to cause cancer, asthma, and heart disease especially in older adults.
