**SUBJECT:** Professional Services Agreement (John Anthony, M.D.)

## **Recommendation(s):**

### That the Board of Supervisors:

Execute Agreement with John Anthony, M.D., contractor on payroll, to provide professional medical services at the County Health Clinics, in an amount not to exceed \$103,000 plus benefits, for the period July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

#### **Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:**

The recommendation is primarily aligned with Goal No. 2. A Safe and Healthy Community in Which to Live, Work, and Visit.

#### **Executive Summary and Discussion:**

The Public Health Department, in accordance with State mandates, provides medical care to those individuals who would otherwise not be able to access the local health care system. Physicians, along with other professionals, provide primary medical care and perform administrative duties to ensure that the County fulfills those mandated services. In order to ensure full staffing for the County Health Clinics the Public Health Department contracts with substitute providers to backfill for regularly scheduled providers on an as-needed basis.

Your Board is requested to execute an Agreement with John Anthony, M.D., for the provision of primary medical care services in the County Health Clinics, as a substitute Contractor on Payroll, for the period from July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003 in an amount not to exceed \$103,000 plus benefits. During this past year, Dr. Anthony was contracted to backfill for ordinance physicians and other contracted positions. As your Board is aware, there have been multiple ordinance physician vacancies in Santa Maria. Dr. Anthony has provided significant fill-in for these vacancies to an extent that requires this contract to supercede his previous Purchasing contract. There are no changes in the terms and conditions from Dr. Anthony's Purchasing contract, rather just a clarification of the dollar amount paid during the current

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fiscal year. Dr. Anthony's willingness to provide fill-in services kept the department from being forced to use commercial substitute services ("locums") that are significantly more expensive. These increased expenditures associated with Dr. Anthony are included in the department's adopted FY 2002-2003 budget.

The Agreement with Dr. Anthony calls for him to attend and staff assigned hours at designated County Health Clinics as scheduled at an hourly rate of pay. The approximated costs of benefits are calculated at \$9,270 and include the Employer's share of Federal Medicare Health Insurance, County Worker's Compensation Insurance, and Malpractice Insurance. This does not represent additional compensation to the Contractor.

#### **Mandates and Service Levels:**

The provision of primary care services are mandated by California Administrative Code, Title 17, Chapter 3, Article 2, Sections 1276, 2500, 2501, 2502, 2503 and 2505; California Administrative Code, Title 17, Chapter 3, Subchapter 1; and Section 17000 of the Welfare and Institutions Code of indigents.

## **Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:**

Because this recommendation is already contained within the Department's FY 2002-2003 adopted budget, it will not increase the General Fund contribution or use of Special Revenue funds for the Public Health Department.

The costs for physician services are reimbursed from the State and Federal governments as a result of the County being a Federal Qualified Health Center (FQHC) providing services for Medi-Cal and Medicare patients, and from State Realignment funding for Medically Indigent Adult (MIA) patient services.

The funding for this contract is contained as part of the Public Health Department's FY 2002-03 adopted budget and can be found on page D-170 of the County's FY 2002-03 Operating Plan in the Lompoc Regional Clinic and Santa Maria Regional Clinic cost centers.

This action will not result in the need for any additional facilities.
