RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING
THE WEEK OF APRIL 22-29, 2006
INFANT IMMUNIZATION WEEK
AND THE MONTH OF MAY 2005
TODDLER IMMUNIZATION MONTH

WHEREAS, community immunization is the only defense children and adults have against vaccinepreventable diseases; and

**WHEREAS**, since the historic low of 75 cases in 1976, pertussis cases have been rising, in 2005 nearly 2,200 cases of pertussis were reported in California; and

WHEREAS, severe cases of pertussis in infants less than 12 months old can lead to pneumonia, seizures, brain damage and death; and

WHEREAS, vaccine-preventable childhood diseases still pose a serious threat to infants and toddlers, and complications are often devastating to both patients and families; and

WHEREAS, a recent survey by the National Immunization Survey (NIS) indicates that California immunization rates continued to improve for ages 19-35 months, with an average of 84.1 percent coverage rate; and

WHEREAS, there is a disparity in the toddler immunization rates between ethnic groups; and

**WHEREAS**, a local coalition of concerned business, public health, and community organizations have joined together to observe National Infant Immunization Week, April 22-29, 2006 and Toddler Immunization Month in May 2006 to bring attention to the need for timely immunizations.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE ORDERED AND RESOLVED** that this Board of Supervisors does hereby proclaim the week of April 22-29, 2006, "Infant Immunization Week" and the month of May 2006 "Toddler Immunization Month."

**PASSED AND ADOPTED,** by the Board of Supervisors, County of Santa Barbara, State of California, this eighteenth day of April 2006, by a unanimous vote of all members present.
