**EMERGENCY PERMIT**

December 19, 2002

Permit No.: 4-02-251-G

Applicants: Santa Barbara County Parks

Project Location: Goleta Beach County Park, Goleta, Santa Barbara County

Work Proposed: Place approximately 2,000 tons of rock at 1:1 to 1:1.5 slope approximately 350 ft. in length at the base of the west Goleta Beach Parking lot and approximately 250 feet in length at the base of the lawn to protect utility lines and restroom facilities. The project includes trenching to a depth of approximately 2 to 3 feet at the toe of the structure. All construction to occur during low tidal periods. Source of rock is storage yard in Goleta.

This letter constitutes approval of the emergency work you or your representative has requested to be done at the location listed above. I understand from the information and photographs submitted that an unexpected occurrence in the form of a collapsed bridge requires immediate action to prevent or mitigate loss or damage to life, health, property or essential public services. 14 Cal. Admin. Code Section 13009. The Executive Director hereby finds that:

- (a) An emergency exists which requires action more quickly than permitted by the procedures for administrative or ordinary permits and the development can and will be completed within 30 days unless otherwise specified by the terms of the permit; and
- (b) Public comment on the proposed emergency action has been reviewed if time allows.

The work is hereby approved, subject to the conditions listed on page 2.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

1. The enclosed form must be signed by the applicant and returned to our office within 15 days.
2. Only that work specifically described above and for the specific property listed above is authorized. Any additional work requires separate authorization from the Executive Director.
3. The work authorized by this permit must be completed **within 90 days** of the date of this permit.
4. The work authorized by this permit is temporary and must be removed prior to May 15, 2003, unless the permanent retention of structures is authorized through a regular Coastal Development Permit. Permanent authorization of the development described in this permit shall require submittal of a complete application for a regular coastal development permit from the California Coastal Commission in order to have the emergency work be considered permanent.
5. In exercising this permit the applicant agrees to hold the California Coastal Commission harmless from any liabilities for damage to public or private properties or personal injury that may result from the project.
6. This permit does not obviate the need to obtain necessary authorizations and/or permits from other agencies.

IMPORTANT

Condition #4 indicates that the emergency work is considered to be temporary work done in an emergency situation. If the property owner wishes to have the emergency work become a permanent development, a coastal permit must be obtained. A regular permit would be subject to all of the provisions of the California Coastal Act and may be conditioned accordingly.
