WHEREAS, Government Code, Sections 8558 and 8630, et seq., and Chapter 12 of the Santa Barbara County Code empower the Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when the County is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity and the Board of Supervisors is not in session, subject to ratification by the Board of Supervisors within seven days and re-ratification monthly; and

WHEREAS, On January 19, 2017 and again on February 17, 2017, severe storms influenced by an atmospheric river condition, impacting Santa Barbara County. These Storms caused conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the County of Santa Barbara, which were beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the combined forces of Santa Barbara County Operational Area to combat; and

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2017, the Director of Emergency Services of the County of Santa Barbara proclaimed the existence of a local emergency within Santa Barbara County as a result of the first storm; and

WHEREAS, on February 2, 2017 in a special meeting, the Board of Supervisor ratified the Proclamation of Local Emergency, and subsequently re-ratified the Proclamation at least every thirty days; and

WHEREAS, preliminary damage estimates for public property are approximately 11.5 million dollars for the January Storm; and

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2017, the Director of Emergency Services of the County of Santa Barbara proclaimed the existence of a local emergency within Santa Barbara County as a result of the second storm; and

WHEREAS, on February 28, 2017 at a regular meeting, the Board of Supervisors ratified the Proclamation of Local Emergency, and subsequently re-ratified the Proclamation at least every thirty days; and

WHEREAS, preliminary damage estimates for public property are approximately 12 million dollars for the February Storm; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors finds that with the end of the rain season and that recovery efforts continue, the immediate threat to the public health and safety no longer exists, and the proclamation should be terminated;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that the proclamations of the existence of an emergency with regards to the January 2017 and February 2017 Storms, are **TERMINATED** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara.
