Per the request of Supervisor Brooks Firestone, a survey of premium rates and increases was performed comparing various county operational Healthy Kids plans:

This chart summarizes the result of inquiries to other benchmark county CHIs as to their amounts of PMPM premiums and premium cost increases over time.

As the chart illustrates, premium costs have remained static or have increased by only a nominal amount (4%), or even decreased (as in San Mateo)

This data was gathered from telephone interviews with the other county plans and premiums may vary due to several factors:

- -- Volume of or scarcity of providers in the county.
- -- Volume of children enrolled (volume spreads risk, which can lower rates).
- -- Actuarial data for the county.
- -- Plan payment rates to service providers (rates vary from 115% of Medi-Cal rates to 130% of Medicare rates. This can be illustrated as a variance in the payment of an expanded office visit from \$30 at 115% of Medi-Cal to \$57 at 130% of Medicare).
