RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING FEBRUARY 2019 AS BLACK HISTORY MONTH IN SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

WHEREAS, Dr. Carter Godwin Woodson, the distinguished African American author, editor, publisher, and historian who is known as the "Father of Black History," founded Negro History Week in 1926, which became Black History Month in 1976, intended to encourage further research and publishing regarding the untold stories of African American heritage; and

WHEREAS, the history of African Americans here in the United States, as well as throughout the ages, is indeed unique and vibrant, and it is appropriate to celebrate this history during the month of February 2019, which has been proclaimed as Black History Month; and

WHEREAS, we celebrated the contributions of African Americans that migrated from Southern States between 1900 and 1960 to find more opportunity, and establish new communities. These contributions to our nation birthed the Harlem Renaissance of music and culture, and changed the demographic of our country.

WHEREAS, we honor the contributions of African Americans that came to Santa Barbara County between 1900 and the 1970's; they established businesses, became teachers and community leaders, all adding to the development of our County.

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDERED AND RESOLVED that this Board of Supervisors declares February 2019 as BLACK HISTORY MONTH, and calls on all residents to celebrate with appropriate ceremonies and activities.
