**Due to Federal Executive Orders and subsequent HUD guidance, the Good Samaritan Shelter Freedom Warming Centers grant was funded by Human Services General Fund rather than CDBG. The funding previously allocated to this project is recommended for reallocation to Domestic Violence Solutions, which was the next highest-scoring application serving a similar population and geographic area, and did not receive a Human Services or Public Services grant in the 2025-26/2026-27 cycle.

***CDBG Capital activities located in Santa Barbara and Santa Maria are required to demonstrate (1) that they will serve residents of unincorporated Santa Barbara County and Urban County member cities, and (2) that they have received or been committed financial, in-kind, or other material support from the city in which they are located.
