Project Description: This proposed project consists of Taxiway and Taxilane F rehabilitation and the rehabilitation of pedestrian access between the terminal and the apron. Activities include the removal and reconstruction of existing asphalt pavement surfaces, pavement pulverizing, subgrade preparation, installation of aggregate base and asphalt pavement, storm drainage improvements, installation of pavement markings, and construction of a pedestrian access ramp.
