Project Title: Santa Barbara Health Care Center Chiller Replacement Project


Project Description: This project will replace the two failed 50 Ton Itzaki Chiller units serving the building. In addition, the building controls system will be modified to allow for the new chiller to be connected to the County-wide TREND 963 monitoring system.
